Synonyms of "Maximize" as a verb (15 Words)

 amplify
Increase in size, volume or significance. The manufacturers have developed a system of amplifying the radio signal.
augment
Enlarge or increase. The recent speech of the president augmented tensions in the Near East.



boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. Boost the voltage in an electrical circuit.
<u>broaden</u>	Extend in scope or range or area. Her interests broaden ed as she grew up.
<u>deepen</u>	Make or become deep or deeper. This event only deepen ed my convictions.
dilate	Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>The woman dilated her nostrils.</i>
enhance	Increase. This sauce will enhance the flavor of the meat.
<u>enlarge</u>	Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. Very often a favourite photograph is enlarge d and framed.
expand	Expand the influence of. The work began as a short story and was later expand ed into a novel.
<u>extend</u>	Thrust or extend out. The war extend ed over five years.
heighten	Make more intense, stronger, or more marked. The stage will be extended heighten ing the grid by 3 4 metres.
increase	Become bigger or greater in amount. The boss finally increase d her salary.
<u>intensify</u>	Make more intense, stronger, or more marked. <i>The dispute began to intensify.</i>
maximise	Make as big or large as possible.
widen	Make (clothes) larger. <i>His grin widened.</i>





Usage Examples of "Maximize" as a verb

- The company was aiming to maximize profits.
- He maximized his role.
- A thriller that maximizes the potential of its locations.





Associations of "Maximize" (30 Words)

assistance	The provision of money, resources, or information to help someone. <i>His job was to give technical assistance over the phone.</i>
augment	Grow or intensify. The pressure augment ed.
<u>behalf</u>	For someone s benefit usually expressed as in behalf rather than on behalf and usually with a possessive. <i>In your behalf</i> .
benefit	Derive a benefit from. Families on benefit .
bolster	Prop up with a pillow or bolster. They bolster ed the seats for a more comfortable ride.
distend	Cause to expand as it by internal pressure. The abdomen distend ed rapidly.



earnings	The excess of revenues over outlays in a given period of time (including depreciation and other non-cash expenses. <i>They saved a quarter of all their earnings</i> .
efficiency	An action designed to achieve efficiency. The boiler has an efficiency of 45 per cent.
enhance	Intensify, increase, or further improve the quality, value, or extent of. <i>This will enhance your enjoyment.</i>
<u>enlarge</u>	Become larger or bigger. They have renovated and enlarge d the four storey building.
expand	Expand the influence of. Alice opened and expand ed in this normality.
expansion	A function expressed as a sum or product of terms. The expansion of a b 2 is a 2 2ab b 2.
fund	Place or store up in a fund for accumulation. He had set up a fund to coordinate economic investment.
help	The action of helping someone to do something. <i>He was helped down the steps.</i>
improve	Get better. Efforts to improve relations between the countries.
increase	The amount by which something increases. The university increase d the number of students it admitted.
increment	A regular increase in salary on an incremental scale. Your first increment will be payable six months from your date of commencement.
<u>magnify</u>	Increase or exaggerate the importance or effect of. <i>Praise the Lord and magnify Him.</i>
<u>prerogative</u>	Arising from the prerogative of the Crown usually delegated to the government or the judiciary and based in common law rather than statutory law. The monarch retained the formal prerogative power to appoint the Prime Minister.
privilege	Grant a privilege or privileges to. <i>Education is a right not a privilege.</i>
proceeds	Money obtained from an event or activity. Proceeds from the event will go to aid the work of the charity.
profit	Make a profit gain money or materially. <i>Record pre tax profits.</i>



profitability	The state of yielding profit or financial gain. Intense rivalry reduces industry profitability .
<u>profitable</u>	(of a business or activity) yielding profit or financial gain. A professionally run and profitable company.
rates	A local tax on property (usually used in the plural.
<u>refurbish</u>	Renovate and redecorate (something, especially a building. The premises have been completely refurbish ed in our corporate style.
<u>reinforcement</u>	A device designed to provide additional strength. Reinforcement s set in the concrete.
<u>revenue</u>	The department of the civil service collecting state revenue. <i>His priority was to raise government</i> revenue <i>and to lower expenditure.</i>
strengthen	Make strong or stronger. This exercise will strengthen your upper body.
<u>upgrade</u>	An act of upgrading something. The power plant received a new upgrade .
