- [labyrinth](#)** A complex structure in the inner ear which contains the organs of hearing and balance It consists of bony cavities the bony labyrinth filled with fluid and lined with sensitive membranes the membranous labyrinth.  
*You lose yourself in a **labyrinth** of little streets.*
- [mesh](#)** The act of interlocking or meshing.  
*If the **mesh** is too big small rabbits can squeeze through.*

**network of paths** An open fabric of string or rope or wire woven together at regular intervals.

**snarl** An act or sound of snarling.  
*A **snarl** of rage.*

**tangle** A twisted and tangled mass that is highly interwoven.  
*A **tangle** of golden hair.*

**warren** An overcrowded residential area.  
*A **warren** of narrow gas lit streets.*

**web** The flattened weblike part of a feather consisting of a series of barbs on either side of the shaft.  
*He found himself caught up in a **web** of bureaucracy.*
