Meadow as a Noun

Definitions of "Meadow" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “meadow” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A piece of low ground near a river.*
- *A piece of grassland, especially one used for hay.*
- *A field where grass or alfalfa are grown to be made into hay.*



Synonyms of "Meadow" as a noun (7 Words)

field

The force exerted or potentially exerted in a field.
*They are outstanding in their **field**.*

grassland

A large open area of country covered with grass, especially one used for grazing.
*Acres of rough **grassland**.*

hayfield

A field where grass or alfalfa are grown to be made into hay.

paddock

A field or plot of land enclosed by fencing or defined by natural boundaries.
*The sheep have returned to their previously grazed **paddocks**.*

pasture

Land covered with grass and other low plants suitable for grazing animals, especially cattle or sheep.
*Areas of rich meadow **pasture**.*

pastureland

A field covered with grass or herbage and suitable for grazing by livestock.

water meadow The part of the earth's surface covered with water (such as a river or lake or ocean).



Usage Examples of "Meadow" as a noun

- *A meadow ready for cutting.*
- *143 acres of meadow and pasture.*
- *A pleasant campsite in a meadow, complete with sparkling stream.*



Associations of "Meadow" (30 Words)

- barley** The grain of barley.
- broadleaf** A tree or plant with wide flat leaves.
- clover** A plant of the genus *Trifolium*.
- cornfield** A field planted with corn.
- dandelion** A widely distributed weed of the daisy family, with a rosette of leaves and large bright yellow flowers followed by globular heads of seeds with downy tufts.
- deciduous** (of a tree or shrub) broadleaved.
Deciduous teeth.
- floodplain** An area of low-lying ground adjacent to a river, formed mainly of river sediments and subject to flooding.
- glade** A tract of land with few or no trees in the middle of a wooded area.
A forest glade.

grass	Cover with grass. <i>The farms were mostly given over to grass.</i>
grassy	Abounding in grass. <i>Try the pleasant grassy Chablis.</i>
grazing	The act of grazing. <i>Large areas of rough grazing.</i>
greenery	Green foliage, growing plants, or vegetation.
harrow	Draw a harrow over land. <i>Todd could take it whereas I m harrowed by it.</i>
hay	Convert plant material into hay. <i>The grass had all hayed off and gone to seed.</i>
lawn	An area of short, regularly mown grass in the garden of a house or park. <i>She was sitting in a deckchair on the lawn.</i>
lea	A field covered with grass or herbage and suitable for grazing by livestock. <i>The lowing herd winds slowly o er the lea.</i>
lush	Tender and full of juice. <i>Lush orchestrations.</i>
orchard	A piece of enclosed land planted with fruit trees. <i>An apple orchard.</i>
pasture	Feed as in a meadow or pasture. <i>They pastured their cows in the water meadow.</i>
prairie	A treeless grassy plain.
rake	Gather with a rake. <i>She raked her fingers through her hair.</i>
savanna	A flat grassland in tropical or subtropical regions.
sod	Cover with sod. <i>The stadium has been sodded.</i>
tare	Weedy annual grass often occurs in grainfields and other cultivated land; seeds sometimes considered poisonous.
timber	Land that is covered with trees and shrubs. <i>A small timber building.</i>
tropical	Relating to or situated in or characteristic of the tropics (the region on either side of the equator). <i>Some plants thrived in last year s tropical summer heat.</i>
tundra	A vast treeless plain in the Arctic regions where the subsoil is permanently frozen. <i>Tundra vegetation.</i>

verdant (of countryside) green with grass or other rich vegetation.
Verdant valleys.

woodland Land that is covered with trees and shrubs.
Large areas of ancient woodland.
