## **Meadow as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Meadow" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “meadow” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A piece of low ground near a river.*
- *A piece of grassland, especially one used for hay.*
- *A field where grass or alfalfa are grown to be made into hay.*



## Synonyms of "Meadow" as a noun (7 Words)

### **field**

The force exerted or potentially exerted in a field.  
*They are outstanding in their **field**.*

### **grassland**

A large open area of country covered with grass, especially one used for grazing.  
*Acres of rough **grassland**.*

### **hayfield**

A field where grass or alfalfa are grown to be made into hay.

### **paddock**

A field or plot of land enclosed by fencing or defined by natural boundaries.  
*The sheep have returned to their previously grazed **paddocks**.*

### **pasture**

Land covered with grass and other low plants suitable for grazing animals, especially cattle or sheep.  
*Areas of rich meadow **pasture**.*

### **pastureland**

A field covered with grass or herbage and suitable for grazing by livestock.

**water meadow** The part of the earth's surface covered with water (such as a river or lake or ocean).



### Usage Examples of "Meadow" as a noun

- *A meadow ready for cutting.*
- *143 acres of meadow and pasture.*
- *A pleasant campsite in a meadow, complete with sparkling stream.*



## Associations of "Meadow" (30 Words)

- barley** The grain of barley.
- broadleaf** A tree or plant with wide flat leaves.
- clover** A plant of the genus *Trifolium*.
- cornfield** A field planted with corn.
- dandelion** A widely distributed weed of the daisy family, with a rosette of leaves and large bright yellow flowers followed by globular heads of seeds with downy tufts.
- deciduous** (of a tree or shrub) broadleaved.  
*Deciduous teeth.*
- floodplain** An area of low-lying ground adjacent to a river, formed mainly of river sediments and subject to flooding.
- glade** A tract of land with few or no trees in the middle of a wooded area.  
*A forest glade.*

<b>grass</b>	Cover with grass. <i>The farms were mostly given over to <b>grass</b>.</i>
<b>grassy</b>	Abounding in grass. <i>Try the pleasant <b>grassy</b> Chablis.</i>
<b>grazing</b>	The act of grazing. <i>Large areas of rough <b>grazing</b>.</i>
<b>greenery</b>	Green foliage, growing plants, or vegetation.
<b>harrow</b>	Draw a harrow over land. <i>Todd could take it whereas I m <b>harrowed</b> by it.</i>
<b>hay</b>	Convert plant material into hay. <i>The grass had all <b>hayed</b> off and gone to seed.</i>
<b>lawn</b>	An area of short, regularly mown grass in the garden of a house or park. <i>She was sitting in a deckchair on the <b>lawn</b>.</i>
<b>lea</b>	A field covered with grass or herbage and suitable for grazing by livestock. <i>The lowing herd winds slowly o er the <b>lea</b>.</i>
<b>lush</b>	Tender and full of juice. <i><b>Lush</b> orchestrations.</i>
<b>orchard</b>	A piece of enclosed land planted with fruit trees. <i>An apple <b>orchard</b>.</i>
<b>pasture</b>	Feed as in a meadow or pasture. <i>They <b>pastured</b> their cows in the water meadow.</i>
<b>prairie</b>	A treeless grassy plain.
<b>rake</b>	Gather with a rake. <i>She <b>raked</b> her fingers through her hair.</i>
<b>savanna</b>	A flat grassland in tropical or subtropical regions.
<b>sod</b>	Cover with sod. <i>The stadium has been <b>sodded</b>.</i>
<b>tare</b>	Weedy annual grass often occurs in grainfields and other cultivated land; seeds sometimes considered poisonous.
<b>timber</b>	Land that is covered with trees and shrubs. <i>A small <b>timber</b> building.</i>
<b>tropical</b>	Relating to or situated in or characteristic of the tropics (the region on either side of the equator). <i>Some plants thrived in last year s <b>tropical</b> summer heat.</i>
<b>tundra</b>	A vast treeless plain in the Arctic regions where the subsoil is permanently frozen. <i><b>Tundra</b> vegetation.</i>

**verdant** (of countryside) green with grass or other rich vegetation.  
*Verdant* valleys.

**woodland** Land that is covered with trees and shrubs.  
*Large areas of ancient woodland.*
