**pastureland** A field covered with grass or herbage and suitable for grazing by livestock.

barley The grain of barley.

**broadleaf** A tree or plant with wide flat leaves.

clover A plant of the genus Trifolium.

**cornfield** A field planted with corn.

A widely distributed weed of the daisy family, with a rosette of leaves and large dandelion bright yellow flowers followed by globular heads of seeds with downy tufts.

(of a tree or shrub) broadleaved.

deciduous **Deciduous** teeth.

Convert plant material into hay.

The grass had all **hay**ed off and gone to seed.

An area of short, regularly mown grass in the garden of a house or park.

She was sitting in a deckchair on the **lawn**.

A field covered with grass or herbage and suitable for grazing by livestock.

The lowing herd winds slowly o er the **lea**.

Tender and full of juice. *Lush* orchestrations.

A piece of enclosed land planted with fruit trees.

orchard An apple orchard.

**pasture** Feed as in a meadow or pasture.

They **pasture**d their cows in the water meadow.

**prairie** A treeless grassy plain.

rake Gather with a rake.

She **rake**d her fingers through her hair.

**savanna** A flat grassland in tropical or subtropical regions.

sod Cover with sod.

The stadium has been **sod**ded.

tare Weedy annual grass often occurs in grainfields and other cultivated land; seeds

sometimes considered poisonous.

**timber** Land that is covered with trees and shrubs.

A small **timber** building.

Relating to or situated in or characteristic of the tropics (the region on either

**tropical** side of the equator.

Some plants thrived in last year s **tropical** summer heat.

A vast treeless plain in the Arctic regions where the subsoil is permanently

tundra frozen.

**Tundra** vegetation.
