Definitions of "Meal" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “meal” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The food served and eaten at one time.*
- *The food eaten during a meal.*
- *Any of the regular occasions in a day when a reasonably large amount of food is eaten.*
- *Coarsely ground foodstuff; especially seeds of various cereal grasses or pulse.*
- *Any of the occasions for eating food that occur by custom or habit at more or less fixed times.*



Synonyms of "Meal" as a noun (2 Words)

repast The food served and eaten at one time.
*A sumptuous **repast**.*

snack A sexually attractive person.
*It ll be a **snack**.*



Usage Examples of "Meal" as a noun

- *The evening meal.*
- *A bar serving light meals.*



Associations of "Meal" (30 Words)

appetizer

A small dish of food or a drink taken before a meal or the main course of a meal to stimulate one's appetite.

*The afternoon games served as an **appetizer** for the evening's heavyweight clash between Borussia Dortmund and Bayern Munich.*

appetizing

Stimulating one's appetite.

*The **appetizing** aroma of sizzling bacon.*

breakfast

Eat breakfast.

*I don't eat **breakfast**.*

brunch

Combination breakfast and lunch; usually served in late morning.

*Breakfast was served so late as almost to constitute **brunch**.*

delectable

Capable of arousing desire.

*The **delectable** Ms Davis.*

delicious

Highly pleasant to the taste.

***Delicious** home baked brown bread.*

dessert	A dish served as the last course of a meal. A dessert of chocolate mousse.
eat	Eat a meal take a meal. <i>I didn't eat yet so I gladly accept your invitation.</i>
flavor	Lend flavor to.
flavour	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>Whitewashed walls and red roof tiles gave the resort a Mediterranean flavour.</i>
food	Anything that provides mental stimulus for thinking. <i>They had eaten their food and slept.</i>
lunch	Eat lunch. A lunch meeting.
luncheon	A formal lunch, or a formal word for lunch. <i>A ladies luncheon was taking place.</i>
luscious	Very sexually attractive. <i>The luscious brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.</i>
palatable	(of food or drink) pleasant to taste. <i>A device that made increased taxation more palatable.</i>
partake	Consume. <i>Visitors can partake in golfing or clay pigeon shooting.</i>
pasta	A dish that contains pasta as its main ingredient.
postprandial	Following a meal (especially dinner). <i>We were jolted from our postprandial torpor.</i>
refreshment	A light snack or drink. <i>An ample supply of liquid refreshment.</i>
repast	A meal. <i>A sumptuous repast.</i>
sauce	Provide a sauce for something season with a sauce. <i>None of your sauce said Aunt Edie.</i>
savor	Give taste to. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
savory	Any of several aromatic herbs or subshrubs of the genus <i>Satureja</i> having spikes of flowers attractive to bees. <i>A past that was scarcely savory.</i>
snack	Eat a snack. <i>It ll be a snack.</i>

starter Denoting something regarded as suitable for a person who is new to a particular activity, product, etc.

*The **starter** motor.*

supper A light evening meal; served in early evening if dinner is at midday or served late in the evening at bedtime.

*We had a delicious cold **supper**.*

tang A tart spicy quality.

*His words came out with a distinct **tang** of broad Lancashire.*

vegetarian Relating to vegetarians or vegetarianism.

*A **vegetarian** restaurant.*

zesty Marked by spirited enjoyment.
