Associations of "Meant" (30 Words)

aim	Specifically design a product, event, or activity for a certain public. <i>It was created with the conscious aim of answering immediate needs.</i>
animus	A feeling of ill will arousing active hostility. <i>The author s animus towards her.</i>
artifice	A deceptive maneuver (especially to avoid capture). <i>An industry dominated by artifice.</i>
boor	A crude uncouth ill-bred person lacking culture or refinement. <i>At last the big obnoxious boor had been dealt a stunning blow for his uncouth and belligerent manner.</i>
browbeat	Discourage or frighten with threats or a domineering manner; intimidate. <i>A witness is being browbeaten under cross examination.</i>
churl	A selfish person who is unwilling to give or spend. <i>This trio are used whenever some churl wants to have a pop at progressive rock.</i>
consciously	In a way that is directly perceptible to and under the control of the person concerned. <i>A vicious and consciously dishonest hatchet job.</i>
deliberately	Consciously and intentionally; on purpose. <i>She was working deliberately.</i>
designed	Done or made or performed with purpose and intent- Havelock Ellis. <i>The aircraft performed their designed functions well.</i>
headed	Having an intellect or personality of a specified kind. <i>Woolly headed thinking.</i>
hector	(Greek mythology) a mythical Trojan who was killed by Achilles during the Trojan War. <i>She doesn t hector us about giving up things.</i>
intend	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>Pigs intended for human consumption.</i>

intended	Future; betrothed. <i>An intended insult.</i>
<u>intention</u>	A thing intended; an aim or plan. <i>He announced his intention to stand for re election.</i>
<u>intentional</u>	Done on purpose; deliberate. <i>Intentional wrongdoing and harm.</i>
intentionality	The quality of mental states (e.g. thoughts, beliefs, desires, hopes) which consists in their being directed towards some object or state of affairs.
intentionally	With intention; in an intentional manner. <i>I wasn't sure if it was intentionally funny or not.</i>
knowingly	In a way that suggests one has secret knowledge or awareness. <i>When a journalist knowingly misleads their readers.</i>
minded	(usually followed by `to') naturally disposed toward. <i>Career minded.</i>
niggard	Ungenerous niggardly.
purpose	The quality of being determined to do or achieve something firmness of purpose. <i>State pensions are considered as earned income for tax purposes.</i>
purposefully	With a useful purpose. <i>We purposefully avoided addressing the problem.</i>
purposely	With intention; in an intentional manner. <i>She had purposely made it difficult.</i>
reconfirm	Confirm again. <i>Berghofer resigned but was reconfirmed as mayor of Dresden shortly afterwards.</i>
<u>signify</u>	Be of importance. <i>Signify your agreement by signing the letter below.</i>
skillfully	With skill. <i>Fragments of a nearly complete jug skillfully restored at the institute of archaeology.</i>
<u>surly</u>	Bad-tempered and unfriendly. <i>A surly waiter.</i>
willful	Habitually disposed to disobedience and opposition. <i>Willful disobedience.</i>
willfully	In a willful manner. <i>She had willfully deceived me.</i>
