



#### Definitions of "Mechanical" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "mechanical" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Operated by a machine or machinery.
- Relating to or governed by or in accordance with mechanics.
- (of a theory) explaining phenomena in terms only of physical processes.
- $\bullet \ \textit{Relating to or concerned with machinery or tools.}\\$
- (of an action) done without thought or spontaneity; automatic.
- Relating to physical forces or motion; physical.
- Relating to the exclusive legal right to reproduce a particular recorded version of a song or piece of music.
- Relating to machines or machinery.



- Using (or as if using) mechanisms or tools or devices.
- Relating to mechanics as a science.


