<b>working woman</b>	A mine or quarry that is being or has been worked.

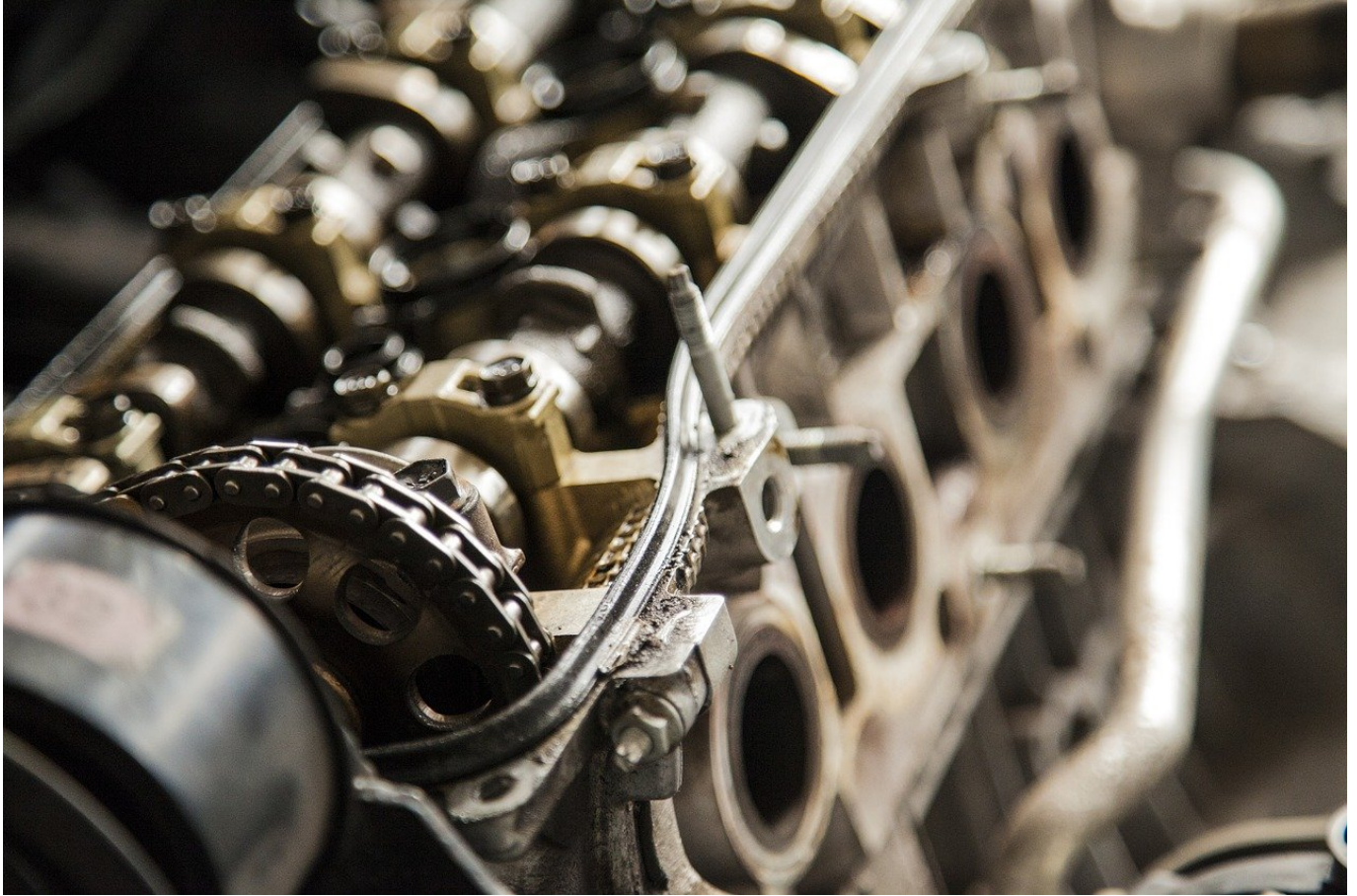

## Mechanical as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Mechanical" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "mechanical" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Operated by a machine or machinery.*
- *Relating to or governed by or in accordance with mechanics.*
- *(of a theory) explaining phenomena in terms only of physical processes.*
- *Relating to or concerned with machinery or tools.*
- *(of an action) done without thought or spontaneity; automatic.*
- *Relating to physical forces or motion; physical.*
- *Relating to the exclusive legal right to reproduce a particular recorded version of a song or piece of music.*
- *Relating to machines or machinery.*

- *Using (or as if using) mechanisms or tools or devices.*
- *Relating to mechanics as a science.*

<b>automated</b>	Operated by automation. <i>A fully <b>automated</b> process.</i>
<b>automatic</b>	(of a firearm) self-loading and able to fire continuously until the ammunition is exhausted or the pressure on the trigger is released. <i>He received an <b>automatic</b> one match suspension.</i>
<b>habitual</b>	Regular; usual. <i>This pattern of behaviour can become <b>habitual</b>.</i>
<b>inattentive</b>	Not showing due care or attention. <i>A particularly dull and <b>inattentive</b> pupil.</i>
<b>instinctive</b>	Unthinking; prompted by (or as if by) instinct. <i>He was an <b>instinctive</b> cook.</i>

<b><u>involuntary</u></b>	(especially of muscles or nerves) concerned in bodily processes that are not under the control of the will. <i>A policy of <b>involuntary</b> repatriation.</i>
<b>machine-driven</b>	Operated by automation.
<b>mechanically skillful</b>	Relating to or concerned with machinery or tools.
<b>mechanized</b>	Made mechanical in character. <i>A <b>mechanized</b> infantry division.</i>
<b>power-driven</b>	Powered by a motor.
<b>routine</b>	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>It was a <b>routine</b> day.</i>
<b>self-propelled</b>	Moved forward by its own force or momentum.
<b><u>technical</u></b>	Of or relating to a practical subject that is organized according to scientific principles. <i>A <b>technical</b> report.</i>
<b><u>unconscious</u></b>	Not conscious; lacking awareness and the capacity for sensory perception as if asleep or dead. <i>Happily <b>unconscious</b> of the new calamity at home.</i>
<b><u>unemotional</u></b>	Not having or showing strong feelings. <i>A flat <b>unemotional</b> voice.</i>
<b>unthinking</b>	Not exhibiting or characterized by careful thought. <i>She was at pains to correct <b>unthinking</b> prejudices.</i>

- abacus** The flat slab on top of a capital, supporting the architrave.
- aeronautic** Of or pertaining to aeronautics.
- aeronautics** The science or practice of building or flying aircraft.
- android** (in science fiction) a robot with a human appearance.  
*There were no **android** security guards to stop him.*
- auto** A motor vehicle with four wheels; usually propelled by an internal combustion engine.  
*The **auto** industry.*
- automated** Operated by largely automatic equipment.  
*A fully **automated** process.*
- automatic** A mode of operation in which a particular function of a piece of equipment is performed automatically rather than manually.  
***Automatic** physical functions such as breathing.*



<b>automation</b>	The condition of being automatically operated or controlled. <i><b>Automation</b> increases productivity.</i>
<b>automaton</b>	A machine which performs a range of functions according to a predetermined set of coded instructions. <i>Like an <b>automaton</b> she walked to the door.</i>
<b>bionics</b>	Application of biological principles to the study and design of engineering systems (especially electronic systems).
<b>calculator</b>	An expert at calculation (or at operating calculating machines). <i>A pocket <b>calculator</b>.</i>
<b>computer</b>	A person who makes calculations, especially with a calculating machine.
<b>cyborg</b>	A fictional or hypothetical person whose physical abilities are extended beyond normal human limitations by mechanical elements built into the body. <i>A <b>cyborg</b> is a cybernetic organism.</i>
<b>device</b>	Something in an artistic work designed to achieve a particular effect. <i>He was recognized by the <b>device</b> on his shield.</i>
<b>dispenser</b>	A container so designed that the contents can be used in prescribed amounts. <i>A paper towel <b>dispenser</b>.</i>
<b>electrical</b>	Of a company or shop manufacturing or selling electrical appliances. <i>An <b>electrical</b> storm.</i>
<b>electronic</b>	Relating to electronics. <i><b>Electronic</b> banking.</i>
<b>electronics</b>	The branch of physics that deals with the emission and effects of electrons and with the use of electronic devices. <i>The <b>electronics</b> have been incorporated inside a connector.</i>
<b>engineering</b>	A room (as on a ship) in which the engine is located. <i>Software <b>engineering</b>.</i>
<b>industrial</b>	Relating to or denoting a type of harsh uncompromising rock music incorporating sounds resembling those produced by industrial machinery. <i>A small <b>industrial</b> town.</i>
<b>kinematics</b>	The features or properties of motion in an object.
<b>machine</b>	Made by machinery. <i>Comedians are more than just laugh <b>machines</b>.</i>
<b>machinery</b>	Machines or machine systems collectively. <i>Long hair should be tied back to avoid it getting stuck in <b>machinery</b>.</i>

**mechanism** A natural or established process by which something takes place or is brought about.

*The immune system s **mechanism** for detecting pathogens.*

The condition of having a highly technical implementation.

**mechanization** *Both characters are portrayed by Dickens as complicit in the **mechanization** of human beings.*

**metallurgical** Of or relating to metallurgy.  
**Metallurgical engineer.**

**robot** (especially in science fiction) a machine resembling a human being and able to replicate certain human movements and functions automatically.  
*Waiting at a **robot** I caught the eye of a young woman.*

**robotic** Of or relating to mechanical robots.  
*A **robotic** device for performing surgery.*

**technology** The branch of knowledge dealing with engineering or applied sciences.  
*Advances in computer **technology**.*

**timepiece** An instrument, such as a clock or watch, for measuring time.
