working woman	A mine or quarry that is being or has been worked.



Definitions of "Mechanical" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "mechanical" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Operated by a machine or machinery.*
- *Relating to or governed by or in accordance with mechanics.*
- *(of a theory) explaining phenomena in terms only of physical processes.*
- *Relating to or concerned with machinery or tools.*
- *(of an action) done without thought or spontaneity; automatic.*
- *Relating to physical forces or motion; physical.*
- *Relating to the exclusive legal right to reproduce a particular recorded version of a song or piece of music.*
- *Relating to machines or machinery.*

- *Using (or as if using) mechanisms or tools or devices.*
- *Relating to mechanics as a science.*


automated	Operated by automation. <i>A fully automated process.</i>
automatic	(of a firearm) self-loading and able to fire continuously until the ammunition is exhausted or the pressure on the trigger is released. <i>He received an automatic one match suspension.</i>
habitual	Regular; usual. <i>This pattern of behaviour can become habitual.</i>
inattentive	Not showing due care or attention. <i>A particularly dull and inattentive pupil.</i>
instinctive	Unthinking; prompted by (or as if by) instinct. <i>He was an instinctive cook.</i>

<u>involuntary</u>	(especially of muscles or nerves) concerned in bodily processes that are not under the control of the will. <i>A policy of involuntary repatriation.</i>
machine-driven	Operated by automation.
mechanically skillful	Relating to or concerned with machinery or tools.
mechanized	Made mechanical in character. <i>A mechanized infantry division.</i>
power-driven	Powered by a motor.
routine	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>It was a routine day.</i>
self-propelled	Moved forward by its own force or momentum.
<u>technical</u>	Of or relating to a practical subject that is organized according to scientific principles. <i>A technical report.</i>
<u>unconscious</u>	Not conscious; lacking awareness and the capacity for sensory perception as if asleep or dead. <i>Happily unconscious of the new calamity at home.</i>
<u>unemotional</u>	Not having or showing strong feelings. <i>A flat unemotional voice.</i>
unthinking	Not exhibiting or characterized by careful thought. <i>She was at pains to correct unthinking prejudices.</i>

- abacus** The flat slab on top of a capital, supporting the architrave.
- aeronautic** Of or pertaining to aeronautics.
- aeronautics** The science or practice of building or flying aircraft.
- android** (in science fiction) a robot with a human appearance.
*There were no **android** security guards to stop him.*
- auto** A motor vehicle with four wheels; usually propelled by an internal combustion engine.
*The **auto** industry.*
- automated** Operated by largely automatic equipment.
*A fully **automated** process.*
- automatic** A mode of operation in which a particular function of a piece of equipment is performed automatically rather than manually.
***Automatic** physical functions such as breathing.*

automation	The condition of being automatically operated or controlled. <i>Automation increases productivity.</i>
automaton	A machine which performs a range of functions according to a predetermined set of coded instructions. <i>Like an automaton she walked to the door.</i>
bionics	Application of biological principles to the study and design of engineering systems (especially electronic systems).
calculator	An expert at calculation (or at operating calculating machines). <i>A pocket calculator.</i>
computer	A person who makes calculations, especially with a calculating machine.
cyborg	A fictional or hypothetical person whose physical abilities are extended beyond normal human limitations by mechanical elements built into the body. <i>A cyborg is a cybernetic organism.</i>
device	Something in an artistic work designed to achieve a particular effect. <i>He was recognized by the device on his shield.</i>
dispenser	A container so designed that the contents can be used in prescribed amounts. <i>A paper towel dispenser.</i>
electrical	Of a company or shop manufacturing or selling electrical appliances. <i>An electrical storm.</i>
electronic	Relating to electronics. <i>Electronic banking.</i>
electronics	The branch of physics that deals with the emission and effects of electrons and with the use of electronic devices. <i>The electronics have been incorporated inside a connector.</i>
engineering	A room (as on a ship) in which the engine is located. <i>Software engineering.</i>
industrial	Relating to or denoting a type of harsh uncompromising rock music incorporating sounds resembling those produced by industrial machinery. <i>A small industrial town.</i>
kinematics	The features or properties of motion in an object.
machine	Made by machinery. <i>Comedians are more than just laugh machines.</i>
machinery	Machines or machine systems collectively. <i>Long hair should be tied back to avoid it getting stuck in machinery.</i>

mechanism A natural or established process by which something takes place or is brought about.

*The immune system s **mechanism** for detecting pathogens.*

The condition of having a highly technical implementation.

mechanization *Both characters are portrayed by Dickens as complicit in the **mechanization** of human beings.*

metallurgical Of or relating to metallurgy.
Metallurgical engineer.

robot (especially in science fiction) a machine resembling a human being and able to replicate certain human movements and functions automatically.
*Waiting at a **robot** I caught the eye of a young woman.*

robotic Of or relating to mechanical robots.
*A **robotic** device for performing surgery.*

technology The branch of knowledge dealing with engineering or applied sciences.
*Advances in computer **technology**.*

timepiece An instrument, such as a clock or watch, for measuring time.
