According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “mechanisms” as a noun can have the following definitions:

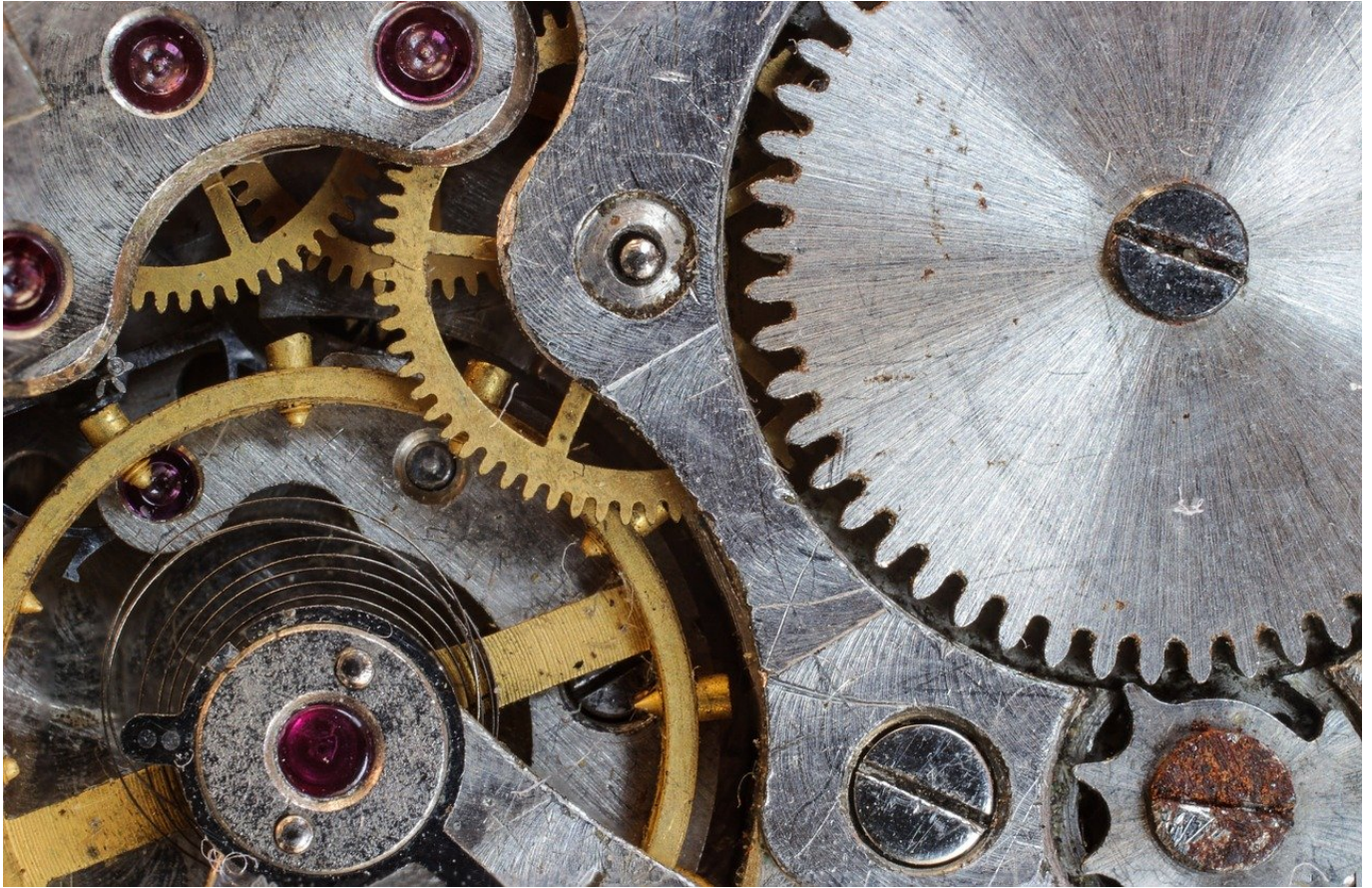
- *The atomic process that occurs during a chemical reaction.*

- *The technical aspects of doing something.*
- *A natural object resembling a machine in structure or function.*

- ankle** The narrow part of the leg between the ankle joint and the calf.

- apparatus** A group of body parts that work together to perform a given function.

- appliance** A device or piece of equipment designed to perform a specific task.

- automatic** A vehicle with automatic transmission.  
*He received an **automatic** one match suspension.*
- circuit** Make a circuit.  
*The judge makes a **circuit** of the courts in his district.*
- contraption** A machine or device that appears strange or unnecessarily complicated, and often badly made or unsafe.  
*Repairing stereos and making **contraptions** out of spare electronic bits.*
- contrivance** The use of skill to create or bring about something, especially with a consequent effect of artificiality.  
*The plot contained too many improbable **contrivances** to be believable.*

<b>convenience</b>	A toilet that is available to the public. <i>They offered the <b>convenience</b> of an installment plan.</i>
<b>device</b>	Any ornamental pattern or design (as in embroidery). <i>A rhetorical <b>device</b>.</i>
<b>dislocate</b>	Disturb the normal position of (a bone in a joint). <i>Trade was <b>dislocated</b> by a famine.</i>
<b>equipment</b>	The process of supplying someone or something with necessary equipment. <i>The construction and <b>equipment</b> of new harbour facilities.</i>
<b>extensor</b>	A muscle whose contraction extends or straightens a limb or other part of the body.
<b>gadget</b>	A device or control that is very useful for a particular job. <i>A variety of kitchen <b>gadgets</b>.</i>
<b>genuflect</b>	Bend the knees and bow in a servile manner. <i>Politicians had to <b>genuflect</b> to the far left to advance their careers.</i>
<b>gizmo</b>	A device or control that is very useful for a particular job. <i>There may be some great new <b>gizmo</b> around the corner that you will want to use.</i>
<b>hip</b>	A person's hip joint. <i>She dislocated her <b>hip</b>.</i>
<b>hock</b>	Any of several white wines from the Rhine River valley in Germany hock is British usage.
<b>jaw</b>	The lower movable bone of the jaw or the part of the face containing it. <i>Victory was snatched from the <b>jaws</b> of defeat.</i>
<b>knee</b>	Hit someone with one's knee. <i>They were eating their suppers on their <b>knees</b>.</i>
<b>lap</b>	A hanging flap on a garment or a saddle. <i>He picked up the little girl and plopped her down in his <b>lap</b>.</i>
<b>ligament</b>	A sheet or band of tough fibrous tissue connecting bones or cartilages or supporting muscles or organs.
<b>robotic</b>	Of or relating to mechanical robots. <i>The lander has a <b>robotic</b> arm that will dig into the Martian surface to collect samples for analysis.</i>
<b>scraper</b>	A prehistoric flint implement with a sharpened edge used for scraping material such as hide or wood. <i>Residues should be removed with sharp <b>scrapers</b>.</i>
<b>shoulder</b>	Push with the shoulders. <i>He <b>shouldered</b> his way into the crowd.</i>

- sickle** An edge tool for cutting grass or crops; has a curved blade and a short handle.
- tinker** Work as a tinker or tinkerer.  
*Can you **tinker** with the T V set it s not working right.*
- tool** A small stamp or roller used to make a tooled design.  
*The beautiful Estella is Miss Havisham s **tool**.*
- trigger** Release or pull the trigger on.  
*People ask how much I weigh but I won t talk about numbers because I know that **triggers** me.*
- tripping** Characterized by a buoyant rhythm.  
*Walked with a light **tripping** step.*
- widget** An application, or a component of an interface, that enables a user to perform a function or access a service.
