
### Mediator as a Noun

#### Definitions of "Mediator" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "mediator" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A person who attempts to make people involved in a conflict come to an agreement; a go-between.
- A negotiator who acts as a link between parties.





## Synonyms of "Mediator" as a noun (19 Words)

adjudicator	A person who studies and settles conflicts and disputes. The proposal to close the school will have to go before an <b>adjudicator</b> .
<u>arbiter</u>	A person whose views or actions have influence in a particular sphere. An <b>arbiter</b> of taste.
arbitrator	An independent person or body officially appointed to settle a dispute. The facts of the case are put to an independent <b>arbitrator</b> .
broker	A businessman who buys or sells for another in exchange for a commission. <i>The centralized lenders operate through</i> <b>broker</b> <i>s</i> .
conciliator	A person who acts as a mediator between two disputing people or groups. <i>He was seen as a conciliator who would heal divisions in the party.</i>
go-between	A negotiator who acts as a link between parties.



intercessor	A negotiator who acts as a link between parties. They rejected the notion that an <b>intercessor</b> was needed to appeal to God.
intermediary	A person who acts as a link between people in order to try and bring about an agreement; a mediator. <i>Negotiations took place through an intermediary.</i>
intermediator	A negotiator who acts as a link between parties.
intervenor	(law) a party who interposes in a pending proceeding.
<u>judge</u>	A public officer appointed to decide cases in a law court. She was a good <b>judge</b> of character.
liaison officer	A channel for communication between groups.
<u>middleman</u>	A person who arranges business or political deals between other people. We maintain value for money by cutting out the <b>middleman</b> and selling direct.
moderator	An arbitrator or mediator. The debates will each feature one <b>moderator</b> and a panel of three questioners.
negotiator	A person who conducts negotiations. <i>US trade <b>negotiator</b>s.</i>
peacemaker	Someone who tries to bring peace.
reconciler	Someone who tries to bring peace.
referee	An official who watches a game or match closely to ensure that the rules are adhered to and (in some sports) to arbitrate on matters arising from the play. <i>Most journals send the <b>referee</b>s reports to the author.</i>
umpire	An official at a baseball game. An <b>umpire</b> was appointed to settle the tax case.





#### Usage Examples of "Mediator" as a noun

# Associations of "Mediator" (30 Words)

adjudicator	A person who studies and settles conflicts and disputes. The proposal to close the school will have to go before an <b>adjudicator</b> .
arbitrate	Act between parties with a view to reconciling differences. The board has the power to <b>arbitrate</b> in disputes.
<u>arbitration</u>	The act of deciding as an arbiter; giving authoritative judgment. They submitted their disagreement to <b>arbitration</b> .
arbitrator	Someone chosen to judge and decide a disputed issue. The <b>arbitrator</b> s authority derived from the consent of the disputants.
between	In between. Layers of paper with tar in <b>between</b> .
broker	Act as a broker. Fighting continued despite attempts to <b>broker</b> a ceasefire.



communication	The successful conveying or sharing of ideas and feelings. <i>Satellite communications.</i>
conciliator	A person who acts as a mediator between two disputing people or groups. He was seen as a <b>conciliator</b> who would heal divisions in the party.
<u>disrupt</u>	Make a break in. Flooding <b>disrupt</b> ed rail services.
intercession	The action of intervening on behalf of another. Prayers of <b>intercession</b> .
intercessor	A person who intervenes on behalf of another, especially by prayer. They rejected the notion that an <b>intercessor</b> was needed to appeal to God.
interfere	Of light or other electromagnetic waveforms interact to produce interference. You promised not to <b>interfere</b> .
interfering	(of a person) tending to interfere in other people's affairs. An <b>interfering</b> old woman.
interject	To insert between other elements. She <b>interject</b> ed the odd question here and there.
intermediary	A person who acts as a link between people in order to try and bring about an agreement; a mediator. <i>Negotiations took place through an intermediary.</i>
interposition	The action of interposing someone or something. He owed the preservation of his throne to the miraculous <b>interposition</b> of a stranger who suddenly appeared in his realm.
interrupt	A signal that temporarily stops the execution of a program so that another procedure can be carried out. <i>Please don t interrupt me while I m on the phone.</i>
<u>intervene</u>	Extend or occur between events. Ludlow took an active part in the events that <b>intervene</b> d between the death of Cromwell and the Restoration.
intervention	The act of intervening (as to mediate a dispute, etc. <i>The purpose of intervention is to prevent unnecessary duplication of lawsuits.</i>
<u>intrude</u>	Thrust oneself in as if by force. To <b>intrude</b> political criteria into military decisions risks reducing efficiency.



matchmaker	Someone who arranges (or tries to arrange) marriages for others. An enthusiastic <b>matchmaker</b> who continually tried to pair off the difficult bachelor with unattached ladies.
meddle	Interfere in something that is not one's concern. Don t <b>meddle</b> in my affairs.
meddlesome	Fond of meddling; interfering. Heaven rid him of <b>meddlesome</b> politicians.
mediate	Occupy an intermediate or middle position or form a connecting link or stage between two others. The disease spread by <b>mediate</b> as well as direct contact.
<u>middle</u>	The middle area of the human torso usually in front. <i>The woman was in her <b>middle</b> forties.</i>
negotiator	A person who conducts negotiations. <i>US trade <b>negotiator</b>s.</i>
<u>nosy</u>	Pry into something. <b>Nosy</b> neighbours.
pacifier	Anything that serves to pacify.
<u>tamper</u>	A machine or tool for tamping down earth or ballast. Someone <b>tamper</b> ed with the documents on my desk.
umpire	Be a referee or umpire in a sports competition. <i>He <b>umpire</b>d the World Cup final.</i>
