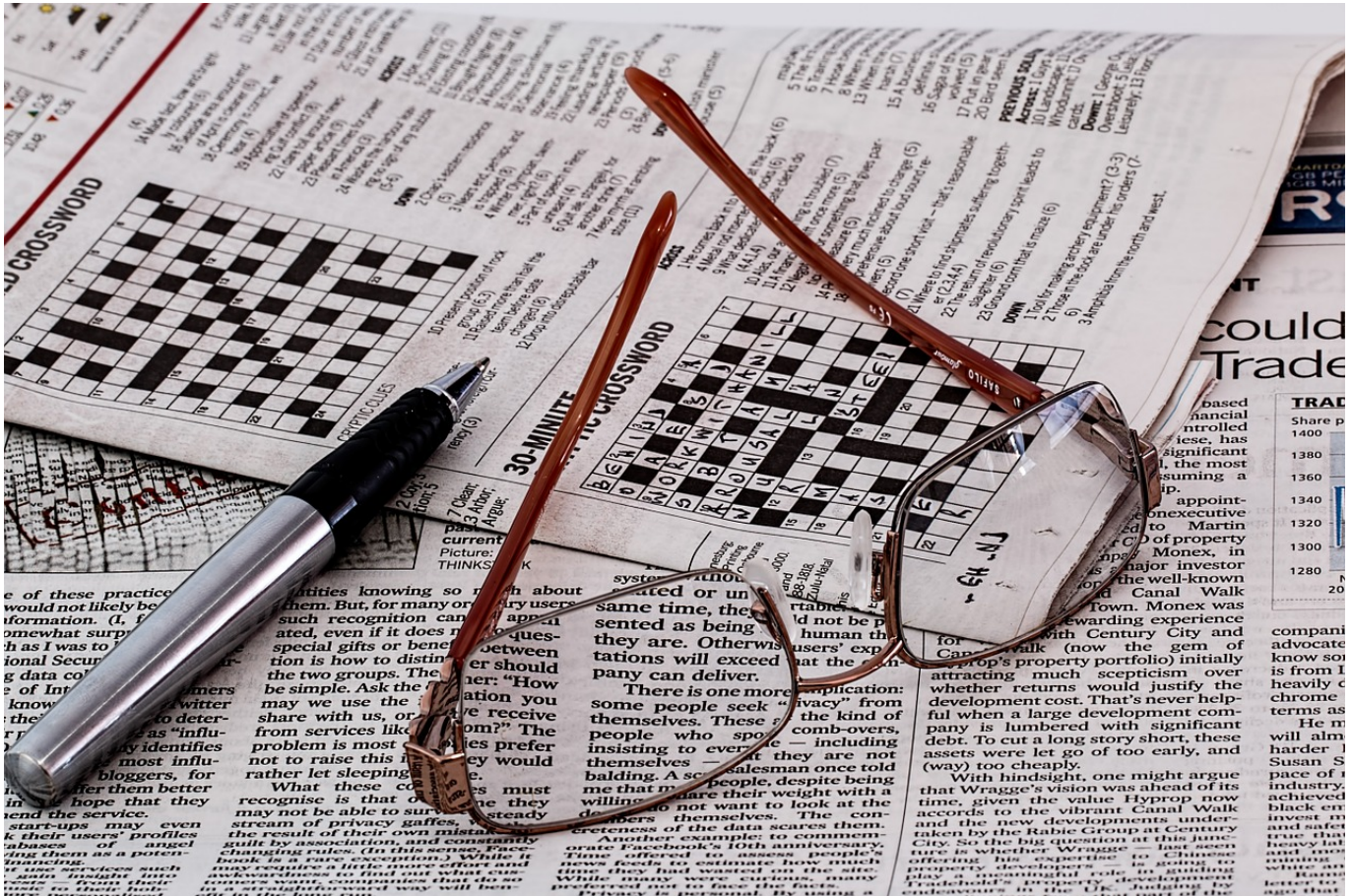
## Medium as a Noun

### Definitions of "Medium" as a noun

- *A state that is intermediate between extremes; a middle position.*
- *An occupation for which you are especially well suited.*

- *An intervening substance through which something is achieved.*
- *The material or form used by an artist, composer, or writer.*
- *Transmissions that are disseminated widely to the public.*
- *A liquid with which pigment is mixed by a painter.*
- *A means by which something is communicated or expressed.*
- *A nutrient substance (solid or liquid) that is used to cultivate micro-organisms.*
- *Someone who serves as an intermediary between the living and the dead.*
- *A particular form of storage material for computer files, such as magnetic tape or discs.*
- *A substance in which specimens are preserved or displayed.*

- *The middle quality or state between two extremes; a reasonable balance.*

- *The intervening substance through which sensory impressions are conveyed or physical forces are transmitted.*

### average

Reduction in the amount payable under an insurance policy, e.g. in respect of partial loss.

### central point

A workplace that serves as a telecommunications facility where lines from telephones can be connected together to permit communication.

<b>centre</b>	A conical adjustable support for a workpiece in a lathe or similar machine. <i>The city was a <b>centre</b> of discontent.</i>
<b><u>channel</u></b>	A service or station using a channel of frequencies. <i>A new television <b>channel</b>.</i>
<b>circumstances</b>	Your overall circumstances or condition in life including everything that happens to you. <i>He found himself in straitened <b>circumstances</b>.</i>
<b>clairvoyant</b>	Someone who has the power of clairvoyance. <i>She has had a message from a <b>clairvoyant</b> that her son is alive and well.</i>
<b>conditions</b>	The atmospheric conditions that comprise the state of the atmosphere in terms of temperature and wind and clouds and precipitation. <i>Hazardous working <b>conditions</b>.</i>
<b>culture medium</b>	The tastes in art and manners that are favored by a social group.
<b>element</b>	Each of more than one hundred substances that cannot be chemically interconverted or broken down into simpler substances and are primary constituents of matter Each element is distinguished by its atomic number i e the number of protons in the nuclei of its atoms. <i>The alchemists believed that there were four <b>elements</b>.</i>
<b>environment</b>	The natural world, as a whole or in a particular geographical area, especially as affected by human activity. <i>A desktop development <b>environment</b>.</i>
<b>form</b>	An ability to perform well. <i>Every distinction in meaning is associated with a distinction in <b>form</b>.</i>
<b>fortune teller</b>	Your overall circumstances or condition in life (including everything that happens to you).
<b>forum</b>	A meeting or medium where ideas and views on a particular issue can be exchanged. <i>We hope these pages act as a <b>forum</b> for debate.</i>
<b><u>habitat</u></b>	A person's usual or preferred surroundings. <i>Wild chimps in their natural <b>habitat</b>.</i>
<b>mass medium</b>	The common people generally.
<b>mean</b>	An average of n numbers computed by adding some function of the numbers and dividing by some function of n.

<b>means</b>	Thing or person that acts to produce a particular effect or achieve an end. <i>He came from a family of very modest <b>means</b>.</i>
<b>means of communication</b>	Considerable capital (wealth or income).
<b>means of expression</b>	An instrumentality for accomplishing some end.
<b>median</b>	The median value of a range of values. <i>Acres ranged from one to fifty two with a <b>median</b> of twenty four.</i>
<b>method</b>	A particular procedure for accomplishing or approaching something, especially a systematic or established one. <i>A <b>method</b> for software maintenance.</i>
<b>metier</b>	An occupation for which you are especially well suited. <i>In law he found his true <b>metier</b>.</i>
<b><u>middle</u></b>	The middle area of the human torso usually in front. <i>A whole is that which has beginning <b>middle</b> and end.</i>
<b>middle course</b>	An area that is approximately central within some larger region.
<b>middle ground</b>	The middle area of the human torso (usually in front).
<b>middle way</b>	Time between the beginning and the end of a temporal period.
<b><u>milieu</u></b>	The environmental condition. <i>Gregory came from the same aristocratic <b>milieu</b> as Sidonius.</i>
<b>mind reader</b>	An important intellectual.
<b>mode of expression</b>	A classification of propositions on the basis of whether they claim necessity or possibility or impossibility.
<b>necromancer</b>	One who practices magic or sorcery. <i>Dr Faustus a <b>necromancer</b> of the 16th century.</i>
<b>norm</b>	Something that is usual, typical, or standard. <i>It set the <b>norm</b> for American homes.</i>
<b>seer</b>	An expert who provides forecasts of the economic or political future. <i>Our <b>seers</b> have grown gloomier about prospects for growth.</i>
<b><u>sensitive</u></b>	Someone who serves as an intermediary between the living and the dead.
<b>setting</b>	A mounting consisting of a piece of metal (as in a ring or other jewelry) that holds a gem in place. <i>The perfect <b>setting</b> for a ghost story.</i>

<b>spiritualist</b>	An advocate of the doctrine that the spirit exists as distinct from matter, or that spirit is the only reality. <i>A non denominational <b>spiritualist</b>.</i>
<b>standard</b>	(especially with reference to jazz or blues) a tune or song of established popularity. <i>The schools comply with federal <b>standards</b>.</i>
<b>surroundings</b>	The area in which something exists or lives. <i>I took up the time admiring my <b>surroundings</b>.</i>
<b>way</b>	A general category of things used in the expression in the way of. <i>That table s in the <b>way</b>.</i>
