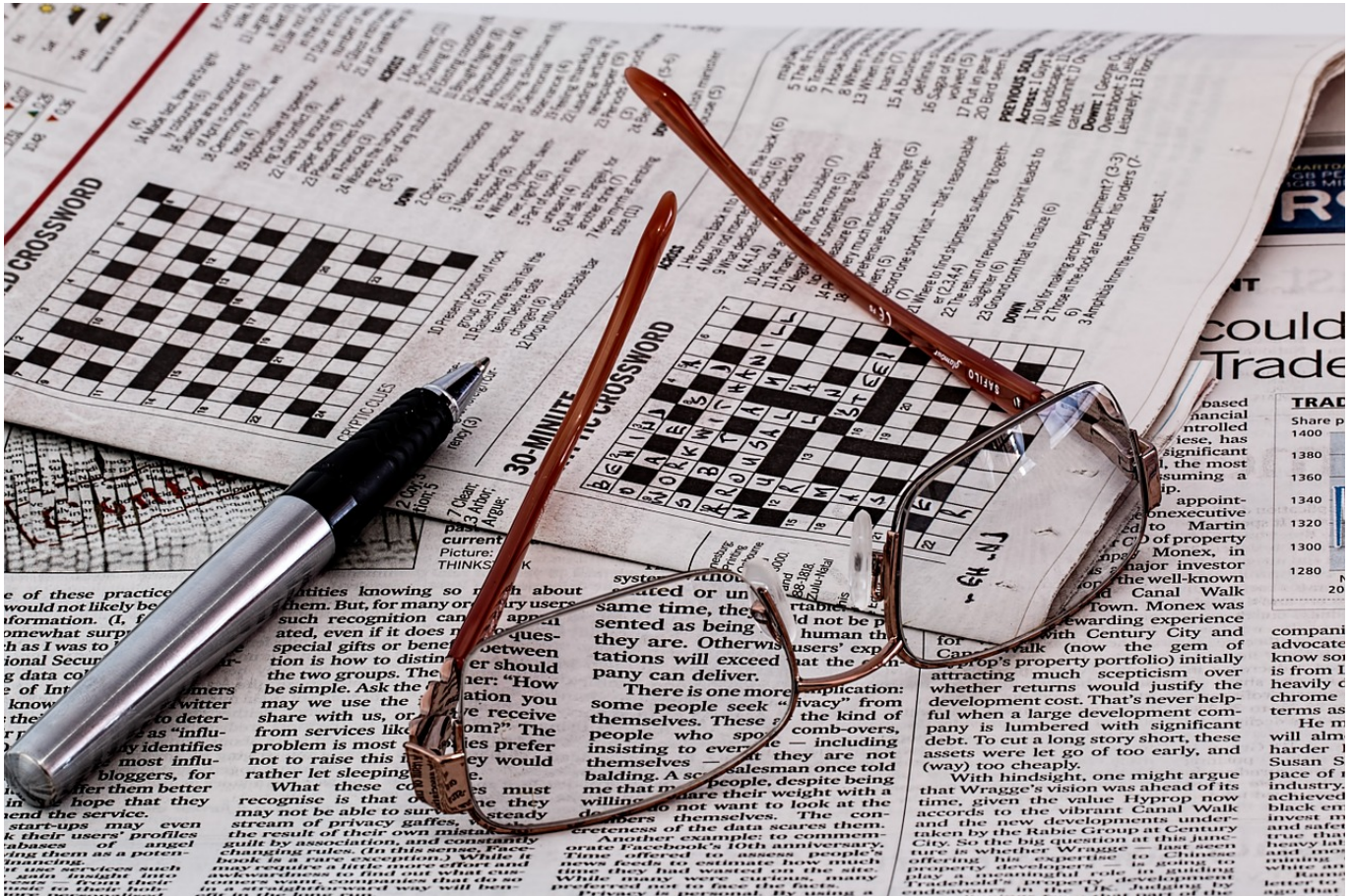
Medium as a Noun

- *An intervening substance through which signals can travel as a means for communication.*
- *A state that is intermediate between extremes; a middle position.*
- *An occupation for which you are especially well suited.*

- *An intervening substance through which something is achieved.*
- *The material or form used by an artist, composer, or writer.*
- *Transmissions that are disseminated widely to the public.*
- *A liquid with which pigment is mixed by a painter.*
- *A means by which something is communicated or expressed.*

clairvoyant	Someone who has the power of clairvoyance. <i>She has had a message from a clairvoyant that her son is alive and well.</i>
conditions	The atmospheric conditions that comprise the state of the atmosphere in terms of temperature and wind and clouds and precipitation. <i>Hazardous working conditions.</i>
culture medium	The tastes in art and manners that are favored by a social group.
element	Each of more than one hundred substances that cannot be chemically interconverted or broken down into simpler substances and are primary constituents of matter Each element is distinguished by its atomic number i e the number of protons in the nuclei of its atoms. <i>The alchemists believed that there were four elements.</i>
environment	The natural world, as a whole or in a particular geographical area, especially as affected by human activity. <i>A desktop development environment.</i>
form	An ability to perform well. <i>Every distinction in meaning is associated with a distinction in form.</i>
fortune teller	Your overall circumstances or condition in life (including everything that happens to you).
forum	A meeting or medium where ideas and views on a particular issue can be exchanged. <i>We hope these pages act as a forum for debate.</i>
<u>habitat</u>	A person's usual or preferred surroundings. <i>Wild chimps in their natural habitat.</i>
mass medium	The common people generally.
mean	An average of n numbers computed by adding some function of the numbers and dividing by some function of n.

means	Thing or person that acts to produce a particular effect or achieve an end. <i>He came from a family of very modest means.</i>
means of communication	Considerable capital (wealth or income).
means of expression	An instrumentality for accomplishing some end.
median	The median value of a range of values. <i>Acres ranged from one to fifty two with a median of twenty four.</i>
method	A particular procedure for accomplishing or approaching something, especially a systematic or established one. <i>A method for software maintenance.</i>
metier	An occupation for which you are especially well suited. <i>In law he found his true metier.</i>
<u>middle</u>	The middle area of the human torso usually in front. <i>A whole is that which has beginning middle and end.</i>
middle course	An area that is approximately central within some larger region.
middle ground	The middle area of the human torso (usually in front).
middle way	Time between the beginning and the end of a temporal period.
<u>milieu</u>	The environmental condition. <i>Gregory came from the same aristocratic milieu as Sidonius.</i>
mind reader	An important intellectual.
mode of expression	A classification of propositions on the basis of whether they claim necessity or possibility or impossibility.
necromancer	One who practices magic or sorcery. <i>Dr Faustus a necromancer of the 16th century.</i>
norm	Something that is usual, typical, or standard. <i>It set the norm for American homes.</i>
seer	An expert who provides forecasts of the economic or political future. <i>Our seers have grown gloomier about prospects for growth.</i>
<u>sensitive</u>	Someone who serves as an intermediary between the living and the dead.
setting	A mounting consisting of a piece of metal (as in a ring or other jewelry) that holds a gem in place. <i>The perfect setting for a ghost story.</i>

spiritualist	An advocate of the doctrine that the spirit exists as distinct from matter, or that spirit is the only reality. <i>A non denominational spiritualist.</i>
standard	(especially with reference to jazz or blues) a tune or song of established popularity. <i>The schools comply with federal standards.</i>
surroundings	The area in which something exists or lives. <i>I took up the time admiring my surroundings.</i>
way	A general category of things used in the expression in the way of. <i>That table s in the way.</i>
