<b>like a lamb to the slaughter</b>	Conforming in every respect.
<b>long-suffering</b>	Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble.
<u><b>mild</b></u>	Humble in spirit or manner suggesting retiring mildness or even cowed submissiveness. <i><b>Mild</b> winters.</i>
<u><b>modest</b></u>	Humble in spirit or manner; suggesting retiring mildness or even cowed submissiveness. <i>A <b>modest</b> apartment.</i>
<u><b>obedient</b></u>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>The <b>obedient</b> colonies are heavily taxed the refractory remain unburdened.</i>
<b>patient</b>	Able to accept or tolerate delays, problems, or suffering without becoming annoyed or anxious. <i>A <b>patient</b> and painstaking approach.</i>
<b>resigned</b>	Having accepted something unpleasant that one cannot do anything about. <i>My response is a <b>resigned</b> shrug of the shoulders.</i>
<b>spineless</b>	Lacking thorns. <i><b>Spineless</b> forms of prickly pear have been selected.</i>
<b>spiritless</b>	Evidencing little spirit or courage; overly submissive or compliant. <i>A <b>spiritless</b> reply to criticism.</i>
<b>submissive</b>	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant S H Adams. <i>She has become <b>submissive</b> and subservient.</i>
<b>tame</b>	Very docile. <i>A <b>tame</b> Christmas party.</i>
<u><b>timid</b></u>	Showing fear and lack of confidence. <i>I was too <b>timid</b> to ask for what I wanted.</i>
<u><b>tractable</b></u>	(of a situation or problem) easy to deal with. <i>A <b>tractable</b> student.</i>



**unprotesting**

Not objecting to what someone has said or done.  
*I was escorted proud and **unprotesting** to the exit.*

**unresisting**

Offering no resistance.  
*She took the box from his **unresisting** hand.*

**weak**

Relating to or denoting the weakest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts only at distances less than about 10 cm is very much weaker than the electromagnetic and the strong interactions and conserves neither strangeness parity nor isospin.  
*A **weak** light from a single street lamp.*

**yielding**

Giving a product or generating a financial return of a specified amount.  
*Too **yielding** to make a stand against any encroachments.*

<u><b>genial</b></u>	Friendly and cheerful. <i>The <b>genial</b> sunshine.</i>
<b>gentility</b>	Elegance by virtue of fineness of manner and expression. <i>Her grandmother s pretensions to <b>gentility</b>.</i>
<u><b>gentle</b></u>	Make or become gentle. <i>The <b>gentle</b> touch of her hand.</i>
<u><b>gracious</b></u>	Exhibiting courtesy and politeness. <i>He bears insult with <b>gracious</b> good humor.</i>
<u><b>humane</b></u>	Pertaining to or concerned with the humanities. <i><b>Humane</b> methods of killing.</i>
<u><b>lenient</b></u>	Tolerant or lenient. <i><b>Lenient</b> magistrates.</i>
<u><b>manageable</b></u>	Able to be controlled or dealt with without difficulty. <i>Her long hair was black wavy and <b>manageable</b>.</i>
<b>merciful</b>	Showing or exercising mercy. <i>William did not believe in being <b>merciful</b> to those who fought against him.</i>
<u><b>mild</b></u>	Humble in spirit or manner suggesting retiring mildness or even cowed submissiveness. <i>She looked at him in <b>mild</b> surprise.</i>
<u><b>obedient</b></u>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>A docile and <b>obedient</b> dog.</i>
<b>obediently</b>	In a manner that shows willingness to comply with an order or request; submissively. <i>The dog had been sitting <b>obediently</b> by her side.</i>
<b>restrained</b>	Marked by avoidance of extravagance or extremes. <i><b>Restrained</b> in his response.</i>
<b>slavish</b>	Showing no attempt at originality. <i><b>Slavish</b> devotion to her job ruled her life.</i>
<b>soft</b>	Soft and mild not harsh or stern or severe. <i><b>Soft</b> southerners.</i>
<b>subdued</b>	Lacking in light; not bright or harsh. <i>A <b>subdued</b> glow came through the curtains.</i>

<b>submissive</b>	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant. <i>A <b>submissive</b> almost sheeplike people.</i>
<b>subservience</b>	The condition of being less important than something else. <i>All his actions were in <b>subservience</b> to the general plan.</i>
<b>subservient</b>	Serving as a means to an end. <i>Editors and journalists who express opinions in print that are opposed to the interests of the rich are dismissed and replaced by <b>subservient</b> ones.</i>
<b>sycophantic</b>	Attempting to win favor by flattery. <i>A <b>sycophantic</b> interview.</i>
<b>tame</b>	(of a plant) produced by cultivation. <i>She was one of the <b>tamest</b> and most abject creatures imaginable with no will or power to act but as directed.</i>
<b>tapping</b>	The sound of light blow or knock. <i>Crews heard <b>tapping</b> from deep underground.</i>
<b>temperate</b>	Free from extremes; mild; or characteristic of such weather or climate. <i>Chile has one of the largest <b>temperate</b> forests in the southern hemisphere.</i>
<b>tractable</b>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded)- Samuel Butler. <i>She has always been <b>tractable</b> and obedient even as a child.</i>
<b>unassertive</b>	Inclined to timidity or lack of self-confidence. <i>She was gentle and <b>unassertive</b>.</i>
