## **Melted as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Melted" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “melted” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Changed from a solid to a liquid state.*
- *Having become liquefied by heating.*



## Synonyms of "Melted" as an adjective (2 Words)

**liquid** Having ready cash or liquid assets.  
*Looking into those **liquid** dark eyes.*

**liquified** Changed from a solid to a liquid state.



## Usage Examples of "Melted" as an adjective

- *Asparagus with melted butter.*
- *Rivers filled to overflowing by melted snow.*





## Associations of "Melted" (30 Words)

- alcohol** A liquor or brew containing alcohol as the active agent.  
*He has not taken **alcohol** in twenty five years.*
- beer** A general name for alcoholic beverages made by fermenting a cereal (or mixture of cereals) flavored with hops.  
*A **beer** bottle.*
- beverage** Any liquid suitable for drinking.  
*May I take your **beverage** order.*
- butter** Spread butter on.  
*Lily **buttered** a slice of toast.*
- carouse** Engage in boisterous, drunken merrymaking.  
*They danced and **caroused** until the drink ran out.*
- coaster** A small mat for a bottle or glass.  
*A West **coaster**.*
- cocktail** A short mixed drink.  
*A **cocktail** of drugs with severe side effects.*
- coffee** Any of several small trees and shrubs native to the tropical Old World yielding coffee beans.  
*We went out for a **coffee**.*
- drink** Drink excessive amounts of alcohol be an alcoholic.  
*The seedlings apparently **drink** much more water than we had realized.*
- fusible** Able to be fused or melted easily.

<b>gulp</b>	An act of gulping food or drink. <i>The men <b>gulped</b> down their beers.</i>
<b>guzzle</b>	Eat or drink (something) greedily. <i>The boys <b>guzzled</b> the cheap vodka.</i>
<b>imbibe</b>	Place (seeds) in water in order for them to absorb it. <i>If one does not <b>imbibe</b> the culture one cannot succeed.</i>
<b>lemonade</b>	A drink made from lemon juice and water sweetened with sugar. <i>The butler served her a <b>lemonade</b>.</i>
<b>licensee</b>	The holder of a licence, especially to sell alcoholic drinks.
<b>liqueur</b>	A chocolate with a liqueur filling. <i>A box of <b>liqueurs</b>.</i>
<b>liquor</b>	Liquid in which something has been steeped or cooked. <i>Waste <b>liquors</b>.</i>
<b>mead</b>	United States philosopher of pragmatism (1863-1931). <i>The tavern stocks beer cider perry and <b>mead</b>.</i>
<b>nip</b>	A small sharp bite or snip. <i>A strong beak which can deliver a serious <b>nip</b>.</i>
<b>potable</b>	Suitable for drinking. <i>There is no supply of <b>potable</b> water available.</i>
<b>quaff</b>	Drink (something, especially an alcoholic drink) heartily. <i>He <b>quaffed</b> pint after pint of good Berkshire ale.</i>
<b>revelry</b>	Unrestrained merrymaking. <i>Sounds of <b>revelry</b> issued into the night.</i>
<b>sip</b>	Drink in sips. <i>I sat <b>sipping</b> coffee.</i>
<b>slurp</b>	Eat noisily. <i>She drank it down with a loud <b>slurp</b>.</i>
<b>sober</b>	Make or become sober after drinking alcohol. <i>His expression became <b>sober</b>.</i>
<b>sup</b>	A small amount of liquid food. <i>The latest <b>sup</b> from those blokes at the brewery.</i>
<b>swallow</b>	An amount of something swallowed in one action. <i>She had <b>swallowed</b> his story hook line and sinker.</i>
<b>tea</b>	A tropical evergreen shrub or small tree extensively cultivated in e.g. China and Japan and India source of tea leaves. <i><b>Tea</b> bags containing <b>teas</b> from selected estates.</i>
<b>vino</b>	Fermented juice (of grapes especially).
