indelible	(of ink or a pen) making marks that cannot be removed. An indelible marker pen.
signal	Notably out of the ordinary. The year saw one signal triumph for the Labour party.
special	For a special service or occasion. Put on special buses for the big game.
unforgettable	Impossible to forget; very memorable. That unforgettable first kiss.

celebrity	A widely known person. He was a baseball celebrity .
conspicuous	Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. A tower conspicuous at a great distance.
distinguished	(used of persons) standing above others in character or attainment or reputation. His distinguished bearing.
eminence	A slight projection from the surface of the body. Her eminence in cinematography.
eminent	Of imposing height; especially standing out above others. One of the world's most eminent statisticians.

excellent	Extremely good; outstanding. <i>Their results are excellent.</i>
feat	A notable achievement. <i>He performed a great feat.</i>
illustrious	Widely known and esteemed. <i>An illustrious achievement.</i>
indelible	(of ink or a pen) making marks that cannot be removed. <i>An indelible marker pen.</i>
ineradicable	Not able to be destroyed or rooted out. <i>Ineradicable hostility.</i>
lasting	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A long lasting friendship.</i>
luminary	A celebrity who is an inspiration to others. <i>One of the luminaries of child psychiatry.</i>
notable	Worthy of attention or notice; remarkable. <i>The gardens are notable for their collection of magnolias and camellias.</i>
noted	Well known; famous. <i>The restaurant is noted for its high standards of cuisine.</i>
noteworthy	Worth paying attention to; interesting or significant. <i>It is noteworthy that no one at the Bank has accepted responsibility for the failure.</i>
noticeable	Undesirably noticeable. <i>Noticeable shadows under her eyes.</i>
obtrusive	Noticeable or prominent in an unwelcome or intrusive way. <i>Equally obtrusive was the graffiti.</i>
outstanding	Of major significance or importance. <i>Works of outstanding banality.</i>
personage	A character in a play or other work. <i>The key explains who all the personages in the paintings are.</i>
phenomenal	Perceptible by the senses or through immediate experience. <i>Phenomenal feats of memory.</i>
prominence	A stream of incandescent gas projecting above the sun's chromosphere. <i>He stood on the rocky prominence.</i>
prominent	A stout drab-coloured moth with tufts on the forewings which stick up while at rest, the caterpillars of which typically have fleshy growths on the back. <i>A man with big prominent eyes like a lobster s.</i>

remarkable	Worthy of attention; striking. <i>A remarkable achievement.</i>
reminder	Someone who gives a warning so that a mistake can be avoided. <i>One man was threatened with court action for not paying his water rates when he did not receive a reminder.</i>
renown	The condition of being known or talked about by many people; fame. <i>Authors of great renown.</i>
renowned	Known or talked about by many people; famous. <i>A renowned author.</i>
significant	Having a particular meaning; indicative of something. <i>She gave him a significant look.</i>
uncanny	Surpassing the ordinary or normal. <i>Stumps had uncanny shapes as of monstrous creatures.</i>
