
### Memorial as a Noun

- A statement of facts, especially as the basis of a petition.
- A written statement of facts submitted in conjunction with a petition to an authority.
- A structure erected to commemorate persons or events.
- A recognition of meritorious service.
- A statue or structure established to remind people of a person or event.
- A record or memoir.
- Intended to commemorate someone or something.





## Synonyms of "Memorial" as a noun (10 Words)

cenotaph A monument built to honor people whose remains are interred

elsewhere or whose remains cannot be recovered.
