foreboding A feeling that something bad will happen; fearful apprehension.

A steadily escalating sense of **foreboding**.

formidable Inspiring fear.

A **formidable** opponent.

frustrating Preventing realization or attainment of a desire.

It can be very **frustrating** to find that the size you want isn t there.

Frighten or overawe (someone), especially in order to make them do

menace

Be a threat or possible danger to.

minatory

ominous Threatening or foreshadowing evil or tragic developments.

Disagreeable to the senses, to the mind, or feelings.

The symptoms are extremely **unpleasant**.

(in a film, novel, or play) a character whose evil actions or motives are

important to the plot.

The industrialized nations are the real environmental **villain**s.

wicked Intensely or extremely bad or unpleasant in degree or quality.
