According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "menial" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- (of work) not requiring much skill and lacking prestige.
- (of a servant) domestic.
- Used of unskilled work (especially domestic work.

Synonyms of "Menial" as an adjective (8 Words)

boring	Not interesting; tedious. A boring evening with uninteresting people.
dull	Not keenly felt. The voice of a teacher talking to a rather dull child.
humble	Of low social, administrative, or political rank. She came from a humble unprivileged background.
humdrum	Lacking excitement or variety; boringly monotonous. <i>Humdrum</i> routine work.
low-grade	Of inferior quality.
<u>lowly</u>	Low or inferior in station or quality. A lowly parish priest.
routine	Found in the ordinary course of events. It was a routine day.
<u>unskilled</u>	Lacking professional skill or expertise. Workers in unskilled occupations are finding fewer and fewer job opportunities.

chore	A tedious but necessary task.

condescendingly	With condescension; in a patronizing manner. <i>He treats his secretary condescendingly.</i>
<u>decent</u>	Decently clothed. From a decent family.
frivolous	(of a person) carefree and superficial. <i>Frivolous</i> ribbons and lacy frills.
humble	Decisively defeat (a sporting opponent previously thought to be superior. Of humble or lowly birth.
humility	A humble feeling. <i>He needs the humility to accept that their way may be better.</i>
<u>inconsequential</u>	Not following logically as a consequence. <i>His work seems trivial and inconsequential.</i>
infinitesimal	(mathematics) a variable that has zero as its limit. An infinitesimal pause.
<u>insignificant</u>	Signifying nothing. Insignificant yet enchanting phrases.
insubstantial	Not having physical existence. Insubstantial evidence.
jack	Used in names of animals that are smaller than similar kinds e g jack snipe. Jack up the car so you can change the tire.
<u>lowly</u>	Used of unskilled work (especially domestic work. A lowly parish priest.
meanness	Aggressive character; viciousness. The meanness of that existence.
mini	Denoting a miniature version of something. A mini dress.
<u>minor</u>	Of an interval characteristic of a minor scale and less by a semitone than the equivalent major interval. A minor in American Indian studies.
moderate	A person who holds moderate views especially in politics. <i>Moderate</i> your alcohol intake.



<u>modest</u>	Free from pomp or affectation. A modest salary.
pettiness	The quality of being unimportant and petty or frivolous. These awesome moments lift us above the pettiness of the world.
petty	Larceny of property having a value less than some amount (the amount varies by locale. <i>Petty</i> theft.
picayune	A small coin of little value, especially a 5-cent piece. The picayune squabbling of party politicians.
puerile	Displaying or suggesting a lack of maturity. A puerile argument.
slight	Pay no attention to, disrespect. A slight romantic comedy.
<u>tenuous</u>	Lacking substance or significance. A tenuous argument.
trifling	Unimportant or trivial. A trifling matter.
<u>trivial</u>	Concerned with trivialities. Huge fines were imposed for trivial offences.
<u>unassuming</u>	Not pretentious or arrogant; modest. He was an unassuming and kindly man.
unbelievably	Used to introduce a statement that is hard to believe. <i>The show went</i> unbelievably <i>well.</i>
undersized	Smaller than normal for its kind. The undersized cubs may not survive the winter.
<u>unimportant</u>	Devoid of importance, meaning, or force. The question seems unimportant .
<u>unskilled</u>	Not having or showing or requiring special skill or proficiency. Unskilled manual workers.
