ascend	(of a fish or boat) move upstream along (a river. <i>Jupiter ascends.</i>
ascending	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>A gently ascending forest path.</i>
ascent	An upward slope or path that one may walk or climb. <i>The first balloon ascent was in 1783.</i>
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The singer had to be boosted onto the stage by a special contraption.</i>
<u>climb</u>	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>Sales were climbing after prices were lowered.</i>
<u>climbing</u>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>Climbing equipment.</i>
<u>elevate</u>	Give a promotion to or assign to a higher position. <i>She ordered the bishop celebrating Mass in her chapel not to elevate the Host.</i>
elevator	A tall building used for storing grain. <i>In the elevator she pressed the button for the lobby.</i>
escalator	A clause in a contract that provides for an increase or a decrease in wages or prices or benefits etc. depending on certain conditions (as a change in the cost of living index.
high	In or to a high position amount or degree. <i>Buying shares low and selling them high.</i>
<u>hoist</u>	Lifting device for raising heavy or cumbersome objects. <i>A white flag was hoisted.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>Employees on their way up the career ladder.</i>

lift	An act of lifting. <i>Lift a ban.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i>
<u>precipitate</u>	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>Cell proteins were then precipitated and washed in 10 trichloroacetic acid.</i>
promote	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>They are using famous personalities to promote the library nationally.</i>
raise	Raise the level or amount of something. <i>Divers have located and hope to raise the submarine.</i>
rise	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>Rise to a challenge.</i>
risen	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	Approaching (a specified age). <i>The Warsaw rising of 1944.</i>
<u>soar</u>	Rise rapidly. <i>When she heard his voice her spirits soared.</i>
<u>soaring</u>	Flying or rising high in the air. <i>The soaring crime rate.</i>
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stepladder	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
<u>underpin</u>	Support with evidence or authority or make more certain or confirm. <i>The theme of honour underpinning the two books.</i>
uphill	Sloping upward. <i>The journey is slightly uphill.</i>
upstairs	An upper floor. <i>No one was allowed to see the upstairs.</i>
upward	Towards a higher place, point, or level. <i>An upward trend in sales.</i>
vertically	At right angles to a horizontal plane; aligned in such a way that the top is directly above the bottom. <i>Vertically stacked books.</i>
<u>zoom</u>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>We can zoom out to view the entire slide.</i>
