Associations of "Messaging" (30 Words)

acquaint	Know someone slightly. <i>She was already well acquainted with his work.</i>
address	Put an address on an envelope. <i>Our officers called at the address.</i>
admonish	Admonish or counsel in terms of someone's behavior. <i>He admonished the people against the evil of such practices.</i>
bulletin	Make public by bulletin.
congratulatory	Expressive of sympathetic pleasure or joy on account of someone's success or good fortune. <i>A congratulatory handshake to mark four years of community success.</i>
convey	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>She conveyed the message to me.</i>
delivery	An item or items delivered on a particular occasion. <i>Allow up to 28 days for delivery.</i>
eloquence	Powerful and effective language. <i>A preacher of great power and eloquence.</i>
email	Send a message by email. <i>Reading email has become the first task of the morning.</i>
gambit	A maneuver in a game or conversation. <i>His resignation was a tactical gambit.</i>
inform	Act as an informer. <i>He wrote to her informing her of the situation.</i>
informing	To furnish incriminating evidence to an officer of the law (usually in return for favors).

letter	Be awarded an emblem in the shape of the initial letter of the name of one's school or university for achievement in sport. <i>The officer in the incident got in trouble for following the letter of the law.</i>
mail	Email. <i>In England they call mail the post.</i>
mailing	The transmission of a letter. <i>The candidate sent out three large mailings.</i>
medley	Make a medley of intermix. <i>A medley range of vague and variable impressions.</i>
notify	Inform (somebody) of something. <i>Births and deaths are required by law to be notified to the Registrar.</i>
orate	Talk pompously. <i>Lend me your ears Fred orated.</i>
postage	The charge for mailing something. <i>The prices include postage and packing.</i>
pronouncement	A formal or authoritative announcement or declaration. <i>Distrust of the pronouncements of politicians was endemic.</i>
relay	Control or operate by relay. <i>Please relay the news to the villagers.</i>
report	Be responsible for reporting the details of as in journalism. <i>The report of his speech.</i>
rhetorician	A speaker whose words are primarily intended to impress or persuade. <i>They're ready to listen to any smooth-tongued rhetorician.</i>
send	Send a message or letter. <i>Send me your latest results.</i>
sender	A person who sends or transmits a message, letter, email, etc. <i>Senders of unwanted emails.</i>
spoken	Uttered through the medium of speech or characterized by speech; sometimes used in combination. <i>The spoken language.</i>
telegram	A message sent by telegraph and then delivered in written or printed form, used in the UK only for international messages since 1981.
tidings	News; information. <i>The bearer of glad tidings.</i>

Inform someone in advance of a possible danger, problem, or other unpleasant situation.

*The doctor **warned** me about the dangers of smoking.*

written

Written as for a film or play or broadcast.

Written laws.
