Definitions of "Messenger" as a noun

- *A person who carries a message or is employed to carry messages.*
- *A substance that conveys information or a stimulus within the body.*
- *A person who carries a message.*



Synonyms of "Messenger" as a noun (14 Words)

- agent** Any agent or representative of a federal agency or bureau.
*His **agent** was able to negotiate a long term contract.*
- courier** A person who carries a message.
*He worked as a **courier** on a package holiday to Majorca.*
- dispatch rider** The property of being prompt and efficient.
- emissary** A person sent as a diplomatic representative on a special mission.
- envoy** Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else.
*The UN special **envoy** to Yugoslavia.*
- errand boy** A short trip that is taken in the performance of a necessary task or mission.
- errand girl** A short trip that is taken in the performance of a necessary task or mission.
- go-between** A negotiator who acts as a link between parties.

harbinger	A person or thing that announces or signals the approach of another. <i>These works were not yet opera but they were the most important harbinger of opera.</i>
herald	A person or thing viewed as a sign that something is about to happen. <i>The chieftain had a herald who announced his arrival with a trumpet.</i>
legate	An ambassador or messenger. <i>A papal legate arrived in France on a peacemaking mission.</i>
nuncio	A diplomatic representative of the Pope having ambassadorial status.
postman	A man who delivers the mail.
runner	A plant that spreads by means of runners. <i>A 400 metres runner.</i>



Usage Examples of "Messenger" as a noun

- *Nitric oxide is an intercellular messenger.*



Associations of "Messenger" (30 Words)

address	Access or locate by address. <i>He persecuted her with his addresses.</i>
airmail	Send or transport by airmail. <i>Letters to Europe from the U S are best airmailed.</i>
barred	Preventing entry or exit or a course of action. <i>A barred gate.</i>
bulletin	Make public by bulletin. (of information) make known; pass on.
convey	<i>Mr Harvey and his daughter have asked me to convey their very kind regards.</i>
correspondence	Similarity by virtue of corresponding. <i>The results of two tests were in correspondence.</i>

courier	Send goods or documents by courier. <i>A courier service.</i>
delivery	The act of throwing a baseball by a pitcher to a batter. <i>She had a difficult delivery.</i>
diplomat	An official representing a country abroad.
email	Send an email to someone. <i>Call fax or email for a free demo.</i>
<u>emissary</u>	A person sent as a diplomatic representative on a special mission.
<u>envelope</u>	A flat (usually rectangular) container for a letter, thin package, etc. <i>The spacecraft detected an envelope of gas around the comet.</i>
<u>envoy</u>	A brief stanza concluding certain forms of poetry. <i>A peace envoy.</i>
letter	Be awarded an emblem in the shape of the initial letter of the name of one's school or university for achievement in sport. <i>We must keep the spirit of the law as well as the letter.</i>
mail	Email. <i>He works for the United States mail service.</i>
mailbox	Public box for deposit of mail.
mailing	The action or process of sending something by mail. <i>The postmark indicates the time of mailing.</i>
negotiate	Find a way over or through (an obstacle or difficult route). <i>They refused to negotiate with the rebels.</i>
philatelist	A collector and student of postage stamps.
philately	The collection and study of postage stamps.
post	A starting post or winning post. <i>She was opening her post.</i>
postage	The sending of letters and parcels by post. <i>Proof of postage is required.</i>
postal	A postcard. <i>A postal ballot.</i>
postcard	A card for sending a message by post without an envelope, typically having a photograph or other illustration on one side. <i>He promised to send me a picture postcard.</i>
postmaster	A man in charge of a post office.
postscript	A note appended to a letter after the signature. <i>He added a postscript Leaving tomorrow.</i>

prophet

In Christian use the books of Isaiah Jeremiah Ezekiel Daniel and the twelve minor prophets.

*He is repeatedly hailed as a **prophet** of modernism.*

relay

A signal or broadcast transmitted by a relay.

*The wagons were pulled by **relays** of horses.*

send

Send a message or letter.

*It s the spectacle and music that **send** us not the words.*

transmit

Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission.

*Sexually **transmitted** diseases.*
