### Definitions of "Messenger" as a noun

- *A substance that conveys information or a stimulus within the body.*
- *A person who carries a message.*



## Synonyms of "Messenger" as a noun (14 Words)

<b>agent</b>	Any agent or representative of a federal agency or bureau. <i>His <b>agent</b> was able to negotiate a long term contract.</i>
<b>courier</b>	A person who carries a message. <i>He worked as a <b>courier</b> on a package holiday to Majorca.</i>
<b>dispatch rider</b>	The property of being prompt and efficient.
<b><u>emissary</u></b>	A person sent as a diplomatic representative on a special mission.
<b><u>envoy</u></b>	Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else. <i>The UN special <b>envoy</b> to Yugoslavia.</i>
<b>errand boy</b>	A short trip that is taken in the performance of a necessary task or mission.
<b>errand girl</b>	A short trip that is taken in the performance of a necessary task or mission.
<b>go-between</b>	A negotiator who acts as a link between parties.

<b>harbinger</b>	A person or thing that announces or signals the approach of another. <i>These works were not yet opera but they were the most important <b>harbinger</b> of opera.</i>
<b>herald</b>	A person or thing viewed as a sign that something is about to happen. <i>The chieftain had a <b>herald</b> who announced his arrival with a trumpet.</i>
<b>legate</b>	An ambassador or messenger. <i>A papal <b>legate</b> arrived in France on a peacemaking mission.</i>
<b>nuncio</b>	A diplomatic representative of the Pope having ambassadorial status.
<b>postman</b>	A man who delivers the mail.
<b>runner</b>	A plant that spreads by means of runners. <i>A 400 metres <b>runner</b>.</i>



### Usage Examples of "Messenger" as a noun

- *Nitric oxide is an intercellular messenger.*



## Associations of "Messenger" (30 Words)

<b>address</b>	Access or locate by address. <i>He persecuted her with his <b>addresses</b>.</i>
<b>airmail</b>	Send or transport by airmail. <i>Letters to Europe from the U S are best <b>airmailed</b>.</i>
<b>barred</b>	Preventing entry or exit or a course of action. <i>A <b>barred</b> gate.</i>
<b>bulletin</b>	Make public by bulletin. (of information) make known; pass on.
<b>convey</b>	<i>Mr Harvey and his daughter have asked me to <b>convey</b> their very kind regards.</i>
<b>correspondence</b>	Similarity by virtue of corresponding. <i>The results of two tests were in <b>correspondence</b>.</i>

<b>courier</b>	Send goods or documents by courier. <i>A <b>courier</b> service.</i>
<b>delivery</b>	The act of throwing a baseball by a pitcher to a batter. <i>She had a difficult <b>delivery</b>.</i>
<b>diplomat</b>	An official representing a country abroad.
<b>email</b>	Send an email to someone. <i>Call fax or <b>email</b> for a free demo.</i>
<b><u>emissary</u></b>	A person sent as a diplomatic representative on a special mission.
<b><u>envelope</u></b>	A flat (usually rectangular) container for a letter, thin package, etc. <i>The spacecraft detected an <b>envelope</b> of gas around the comet.</i>
<b><u>envoy</u></b>	A brief stanza concluding certain forms of poetry. <i>A peace <b>envoy</b>.</i>
<b>letter</b>	Be awarded an emblem in the shape of the initial letter of the name of one's school or university for achievement in sport. <i>We must keep the spirit of the law as well as the <b>letter</b>.</i>
<b>mail</b>	Email. <i>He works for the United States <b>mail</b> service.</i>
<b>mailbox</b>	Public box for deposit of mail.
<b>mailing</b>	The action or process of sending something by mail. <i>The postmark indicates the time of <b>mailing</b>.</i>
<b>negotiate</b>	Find a way over or through (an obstacle or difficult route). <i>They refused to <b>negotiate</b> with the rebels.</i>
<b>philatelist</b>	A collector and student of postage stamps.
<b>philately</b>	The collection and study of postage stamps.
<b>post</b>	A starting post or winning post. <i>She was opening her <b>post</b>.</i>
<b>postage</b>	The sending of letters and parcels by post. <i>Proof of <b>postage</b> is required.</i>
<b>postal</b>	A postcard. <i>A <b>postal</b> ballot.</i>
<b>postcard</b>	A card for sending a message by post without an envelope, typically having a photograph or other illustration on one side. <i>He promised to send me a picture <b>postcard</b>.</i>
<b>postmaster</b>	A man in charge of a post office.
<b>postscript</b>	A note appended to a letter after the signature. <i>He added a <b>postscript</b> Leaving tomorrow.</i>

**prophet**

In Christian use the books of Isaiah Jeremiah Ezekiel Daniel and the twelve minor prophets.

*He is repeatedly hailed as a **prophet** of modernism.*

**relay**

A signal or broadcast transmitted by a relay.

*The wagons were pulled by **relays** of horses.*

**send**

Send a message or letter.

*It s the spectacle and music that **send** us not the words.*

**transmit**

Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission.

*Sexually **transmitted** diseases.*
