<b>addle</b>	Become rotten. <i>Being in love must have <b>addled</b> your brain.</i>
<b>bedlam</b>	A state of extreme confusion and disorder. <i>There was <b>bedlam</b> in the courtroom.</i>
<b>chaos</b>	The first created being, from which came the primeval deities Gaia, Tartarus, Erebus, and Nyx. <i>Snow caused <b>chaos</b> in the region.</i>
<a href="#"><b>chaotic</b></a>	Of or relating to a sensitive dependence on initial conditions. <i>The political situation was <b>chaotic</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>clutter</b></a>	A collection of things lying about in an untidy state. <i>The room was in a <b>clutter</b> of smelly untidiness.</i>
<b>confuse</b>	Be confusing or perplexing to; cause to be unable to think clearly. <i>Her remarks <b>confused</b> the debate.</i>
<b>confusion</b>	An act causing a disorderly combination of elements with identities lost and distinctions blended. <i>The <b>confusion</b> of tongues at the Tower of Babel.</i>
<b>crowding</b>	A situation in which people or things are crowded together. <i>He didn't like the <b>crowding</b> on the beach.</i>
<b>disheveled</b>	In disarray; extremely disorderly- Al Spiers. <i>Her clothing was <b>disheveled</b>.</i>
<b>disorder</b>	Bring disorder to. <i>They are <b>disordering</b> the political landscape.</i>
<b>distracted</b>	Unable to concentrate because one is preoccupied by something worrying or unpleasant. <i>Charlotte seemed too <b>distracted</b> to give him much attention.</i>
<a href="#"><b>disturbance</b></a>	A disorderly outburst or tumult. <i>There was too much anger and <b>disturbance</b>.</i>

<b>hash</b>	Make meat or other food into a hash. <i>A <b>hash</b> of raw tomatoes chillies and coriander.</i>
<b><u>hodgepodge</u></b>	A motley assortment of things. <i>Rob s living room was a <b>hodgepodge</b> of modern furniture and antiques.</i>
<b>jumble</b>	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>A drawer full of letters <b>jumbled</b> together.</i>
<b>lousy</b>	Very poor or bad. <i><b>Lousy</b> weather.</i>
<b><u>mayhem</u></b>	The willful and unlawful crippling or mutilation of another person. <i>Complete <b>mayhem</b> broke out.</i>
<b><u>messy</u></b>	Generating or involving mess. <i>A <b>messy</b> divorce.</i>
<b><u>mingle</u></b>	Move among and engage with others at a social function. <i>Resourcefully he <b>mingled</b> music and dance.</i>
<b>muddle</b>	An untidy and disorganized state or collection. <i>Paul was hopelessly <b>muddled</b> by the rates of exchange.</i>
<b>pandemonium</b>	A state of extreme confusion and disorder. <i>There was complete <b>pandemonium</b> everyone just panicked.</i>
<b>perturbation</b>	A minor deviation in the course of a celestial body, caused by the attraction of a neighbouring body. <i>The term distress connotes some degree of <b>perturbation</b> and emotional upset.</i>
<b>rumple</b>	Become wrinkled or crumpled or creased. <i>She left her clothes in a <b>rumple</b> on the floor.</i>
<b><u>smother</u></b>	Suppress (a feeling or action). <i>Othello <b>smothered</b> Desdemona with a pillow.</i>
<b>tumult</b>	A state of commotion and noise and confusion. <i>The whole neighbourhood was in a state of fear and <b>tumult</b>.</i>
<b><u>turbulence</u></b>	A state of conflict or confusion. <i>The industrial revolution was a period of great <b>turbulence</b>.</i>
<b><u>turmoil</u></b>	A state of great disturbance, confusion, or uncertainty. <i>The country was in <b>turmoil</b>.</i>
<b>unkempt</b>	Not neatly combed. <i>Native vistas and <b>unkempt</b> rambling paths.</i>
<b>untidy</b>	Not neat and tidy. <i>The place was dreadfully <b>untidy</b>.</i>
