Associations of "Met" (30 Words)

assemble	Create by putting components or members together. <i>We assembled in the church basement.</i>
beloved	A beloved person used as terms of endearment. <i>The stark council estates beloved of town planners in the 1960s.</i>
confront	Deal with (something unpleasant) head on. <i>We confronted him with the evidence.</i>
confrontation	A situation where two players or sides compete to win a sporting contest. <i>The government was not ready for a confrontation with the unions.</i>
conjugal	Relating to marriage or the relationship between a married couple. <i>Conjugal visits.</i>
connubial	Of or relating to marriage or to the relationship between a wife and husband. <i>Their connubial bed.</i>
contact	Be in direct physical contact with make contact. <i>Contact dermatitis.</i>
converge	(of a series) approximate in the sum of its terms towards a definite limit. <i>The aims of the two developments can and should converge.</i>
darling	A lovable or endearing person. <i>His darling wife.</i>
dearly	In a sincere and heartfelt manner. <i>He loved his parents dearly.</i>
encounter	A hostile disagreement face-to-face. <i>His close encounter with death.</i>
eros	God of love; son of Aphrodite; identified with Roman Cupid.

<u>fulfil</u>	Complete (a period of time or piece of work). <i>Goods must fulfil three basic conditions.</i>
greeting	An acknowledgment or expression of good will (especially on meeting). <i>Mandy shouted a greeting.</i>
handshake	An exchange of standardized signals between devices in a computer network regulating the transfer of data.
<u>hello</u>	An utterance of hello a greeting. <i>Every morning they exchanged polite hellos.</i>
<u>here</u>	Being here now. <i>Here s my brother.</i>
humanity	The quality of being humane. <i>Appalling crimes against humanity.</i>
introduce	Put or introduce into something. <i>A device which introduces chlorine into the pool automatically.</i>
kissing	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs).
<u>liaison</u>	A person who acts as a link to assist communication or cooperation between people. <i>The head porter works in close liaison with the reception office.</i>
love	A personified figure of love often represented as Cupid. <i>I love cooking.</i>
<u>merge</u>	Combine or cause to combine to form a single entity. <i>The merchant bank merged with another broker.</i>
<u>paramour</u>	A woman who cohabits with an important man.
person-to-person	A human body (usually including the clothing).
platonic	(of love or friendship) intimate and affectionate but not sexual. <i>Platonic love.</i>
relationship	A relation between people relationship is often used where relation would serve as in the relationship between inflation and unemployment but the preferred usage of relationship is for human relations or states of relatednes. <i>She has a daughter from a previous relationship.</i>
<u>reunite</u>	Unify again, as of a country. <i>The three friends reunited in 1959.</i>
subtend	(of a line, arc, or figure) form (an angle) at a particular point when straight lines from its extremities are joined at that point. <i>The main beauty is provided by the bracts which subtend the flowers.</i>

tangency

(electronics) a junction where things (as two electrical conductors) touch or are in physical contact.
