## Associations of "Met" (30 Words)

<b><u>assemble</u></b>	Create by putting components or members together. <i>We <b>assembled</b> in the church basement.</i>
<b><u>beloved</u></b>	A beloved person used as terms of endearment. <i>The stark council estates <b>beloved</b> of town planners in the 1960s.</i>
<b>confront</b>	Deal with (something unpleasant) head on. <i>We <b>confronted</b> him with the evidence.</i>
<b><u>confrontation</u></b>	A situation where two players or sides compete to win a sporting contest. <i>The government was not ready for a <b>confrontation</b> with the unions.</i>
<b>conjugal</b>	Relating to marriage or the relationship between a married couple. <i><b>Conjugal</b> visits.</i>
<b>connubial</b>	Of or relating to marriage or to the relationship between a wife and husband. <i>Their <b>connubial</b> bed.</i>
<b>contact</b>	Be in direct physical contact with make contact. <i><b>Contact</b> dermatitis.</i>
<b>converge</b>	(of a series) approximate in the sum of its terms towards a definite limit. <i>The aims of the two developments can and should <b>converge</b>.</i>
<b><u>darling</u></b>	A lovable or endearing person. <i>His <b>darling</b> wife.</i>
<b>dearly</b>	In a sincere and heartfelt manner. <i>He loved his parents <b>dearly</b>.</i>
<b>encounter</b>	A hostile disagreement face-to-face. <i>His close <b>encounter</b> with death.</i>
<b>eros</b>	God of love; son of Aphrodite; identified with Roman Cupid.

<b><u>fulfil</u></b>	Complete (a period of time or piece of work). <i>Goods must <b>fulfil</b> three basic conditions.</i>
<b>greeting</b>	An acknowledgment or expression of good will (especially on meeting). <i>Mandy shouted a <b>greeting</b>.</i>
<b>handshake</b>	An exchange of standardized signals between devices in a computer network regulating the transfer of data.
<b><u>hello</u></b>	An utterance of hello a greeting. <i>Every morning they exchanged polite <b>hellos</b>.</i>
<b><u>here</u></b>	Being here now. <i><b>Here</b> s my brother.</i>
<b>humanity</b>	The quality of being humane. <i>Appalling crimes against <b>humanity</b>.</i>
<b>introduce</b>	Put or introduce into something. <i>A device which <b>introduces</b> chlorine into the pool automatically.</i>
<b>kissing</b>	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs).
<b><u>liaison</u></b>	A person who acts as a link to assist communication or cooperation between people. <i>The head porter works in close <b>liaison</b> with the reception office.</i>
<b>love</b>	A personified figure of love often represented as Cupid. <i>I <b>love</b> cooking.</i>
<b><u>merge</u></b>	Combine or cause to combine to form a single entity. <i>The merchant bank <b>merged</b> with another broker.</i>
<b><u>paramour</u></b>	A woman who cohabits with an important man.
<b>person-to-person</b>	A human body (usually including the clothing).
<b>platonic</b>	(of love or friendship) intimate and affectionate but not sexual. <i><b>Platonic</b> love.</i>
<b>relationship</b>	A relation between people relationship is often used where relation would serve as in the relationship between inflation and unemployment but the preferred usage of relationship is for human relations or states of relatednes. <i>She has a daughter from a previous <b>relationship</b>.</i>
<b><u>reunite</u></b>	Unify again, as of a country. <i>The three friends <b>reunited</b> in 1959.</i>
<b>subtend</b>	(of a line, arc, or figure) form (an angle) at a particular point when straight lines from its extremities are joined at that point. <i>The main beauty is provided by the bracts which <b>subtend</b> the flowers.</i>

(electronics) a junction where things (as two electrical conductors) touch or are in physical contact.
