- *A mixture containing two or more metallic elements or metallic and nonmetallic elements usually fused together or dissolving into each other when molten.*
- *The steel tracks of a railway.*

- *Broken stone for use in making roads.*
- *Gold and silver (as tinctures in blazoning).*
- *Heavy metal or similar rock music.*
- *Molten glass before it is blown or cast.*

- tarmac** Surface a road or other outdoor area with tarmac or a similar material.  
*They ll be wanting to **tarmac** the path.*
- tile** Cover with tiles.  
*The lobby was **tiled** in blue.*
- top** Provide with a top or topping.  
*He was baffled as to how he could **top** his past work.*

- *Several miles of the old road had been **metalled** with crushed stone.*

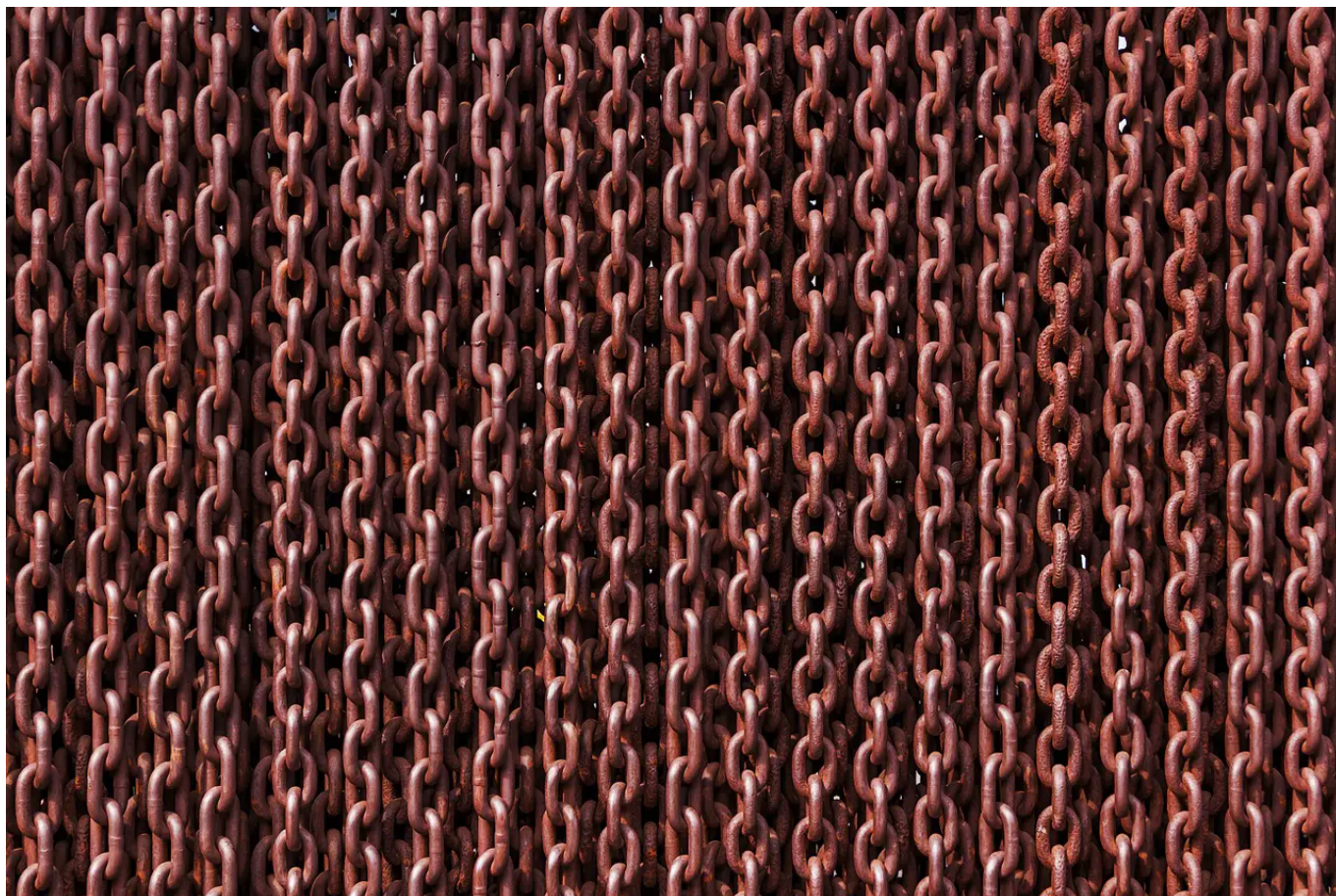

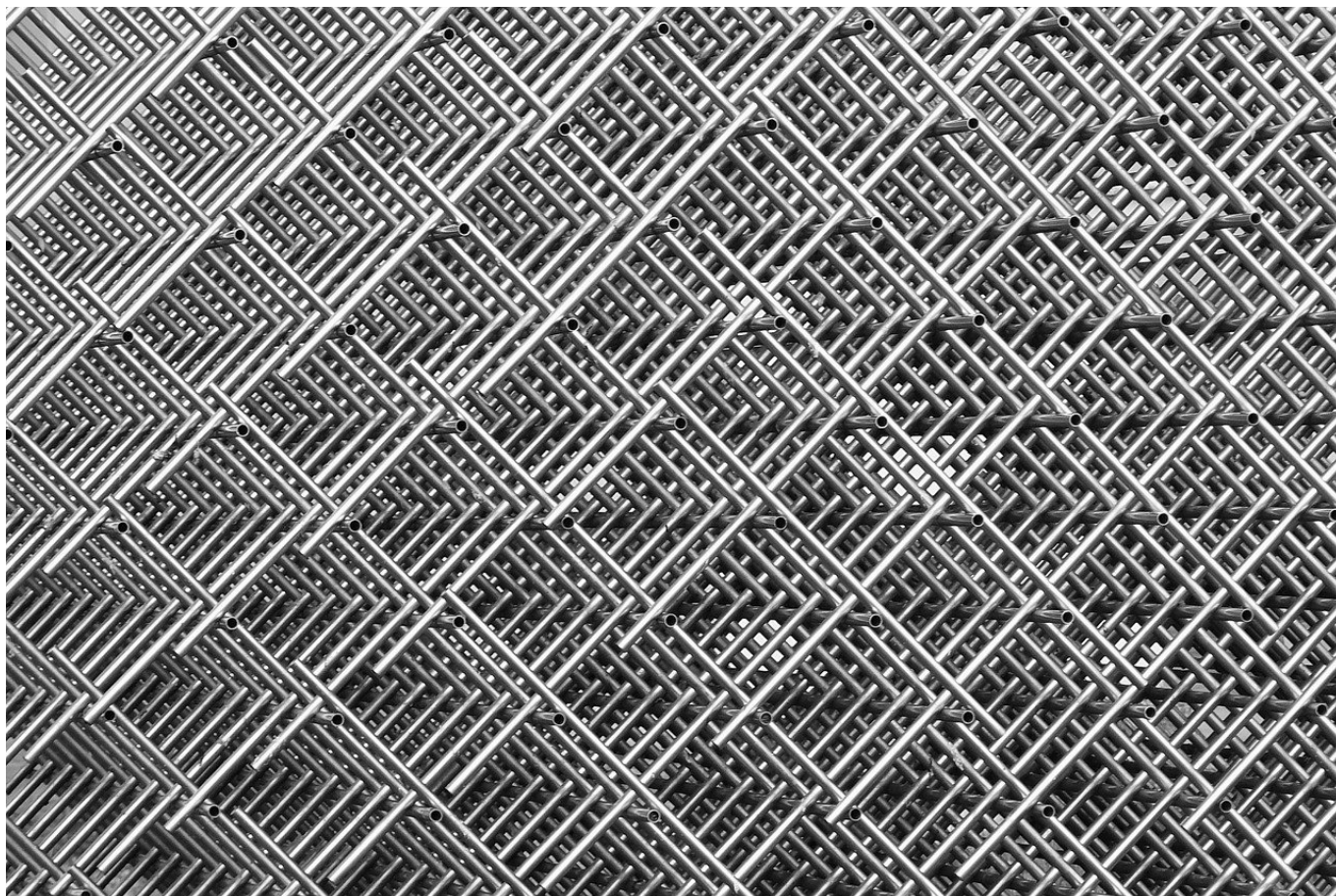

<b>acid</b>	Having the characteristics of an acid. <i><b>Acid</b> fruit.</i>
<b><u>alkaline</u></b>	Relating to or containing an alkali; having a pH greater than 7. <i>A slightly <b>alkaline</b> solution.</i>
<b><u>alloy</u></b>	Make an alloy of. <i>An <b>alloy</b> of nickel bronze and zinc.</i>
<b>brass</b>	The section of a band or orchestra that plays brass instruments. <i>They wanted to spend their newly acquired <b>brass</b>.</i>

<b>chloride</b>	Any salt of hydrochloric acid containing the chloride ion. <i>The presence of sulphates <b>chlorides</b> and nitrates.</i>
<b>copper</b>	Brown coins of low value made of copper or bronze. <i>She had <b>copper</b> coloured hair.</i>
<b>corrode</b>	(of metal or other materials) be destroyed or damaged slowly by chemical action. <i>The metal <b>corroded</b>.</i>
<b>ferrous</b>	Of or relating to or containing iron.
<b>grate</b>	Furnish with a grate. <i>The buzzing sound <b>grated</b> on her nerves.</i>
<b>hydroxide</b>	A compound of a metal with the hydroxide ion OH as in many alkalis or the group OH.
<b>ion</b>	An atom or molecule with a net electric charge due to the loss or gain of one or more electrons. <i>A sulphate <b>ion</b>.</i>
<b>iron</b>	A meteorite containing a high proportion of iron. <i>The <b>iron</b> grip of the president on every aspect of foreign policy.</i>
<b>lithium</b>	Lithium carbonate or another lithium salt used as a mood stabilizing drug.
<b>manganese</b>	The black dioxide of manganese as an industrial raw material or additive especially in glass making.
<b>metallic</b>	A paint fabric or colour with a metallic sheen. <i><b>Metallic</b> alloys.</i>
<b>nickel</b>	Plate with nickel. <i>We will see gasoline prices go up about a <b>nickel</b>.</i>
<b>nitrate</b>	Treat with nitric acid so as to change an organic compound into a nitrate. <i><b>Nitrated</b> polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons.</i>
<b>nitrogen</b>	The chemical element of atomic number 7 a colourless odourless unreactive gas that forms about 78 per cent of the earth's atmosphere Liquid nitrogen made by distilling liquid air boils at 77.4 kelvins 195.8 C and is used as a coolant.
<b>oxide</b>	A binary compound of oxygen with another element or group. <i>Nitrogen <b>oxide</b>.</i>

<b>polymer</b>	A substance which has a molecular structure built up chiefly or completely from a large number of similar units bonded together, e.g. many synthetic organic materials used as plastics and resins.
<b>potassium</b>	The chemical element of atomic number 19, a soft silvery-white reactive metal of the alkali metal group.
<b>silicate</b>	Any of the many minerals consisting of silica combined with metal oxides, forming a major component of the rocks of the earth's crust.
<b><u>silver</u></b>	Provide mirror glass with a backing of a silver coloured material in order to make it reflective. <i>Her worries had <b>silvered</b> her hair.</i>
<b>sodium</b>	A silvery soft waxy metallic element of the alkali metal group; occurs abundantly in natural compounds (especially in salt water); burns with a yellow flame and reacts violently in water; occurs in sea water and in the mineral halite (r.
<b>zinc</b>	Coat or cover with zinc. <i>The metal has to be <b>zinc</b>ed to prevent oxidation and decay.</i>
