- *Any of several chemical elements that are usually shiny solids that conduct heat or electricity and can be formed into sheets etc.*
- *A mixture containing two or more metallic elements or metallic and nonmetallic elements usually fused together or dissolving into each other when molten.*
- *The steel tracks of a railway.*

- *Broken stone for use in making roads.*
- *Gold and silver (as tinctures in blazoning).*
- *Heavy metal or similar rock music.*
- *Molten glass before it is blown or cast.*

rail

Railways as a means of transport.

*The lobby was **tiled** in blue.*
- top** Provide with a top or topping.
*He was baffled as to how he could **top** his past work.*

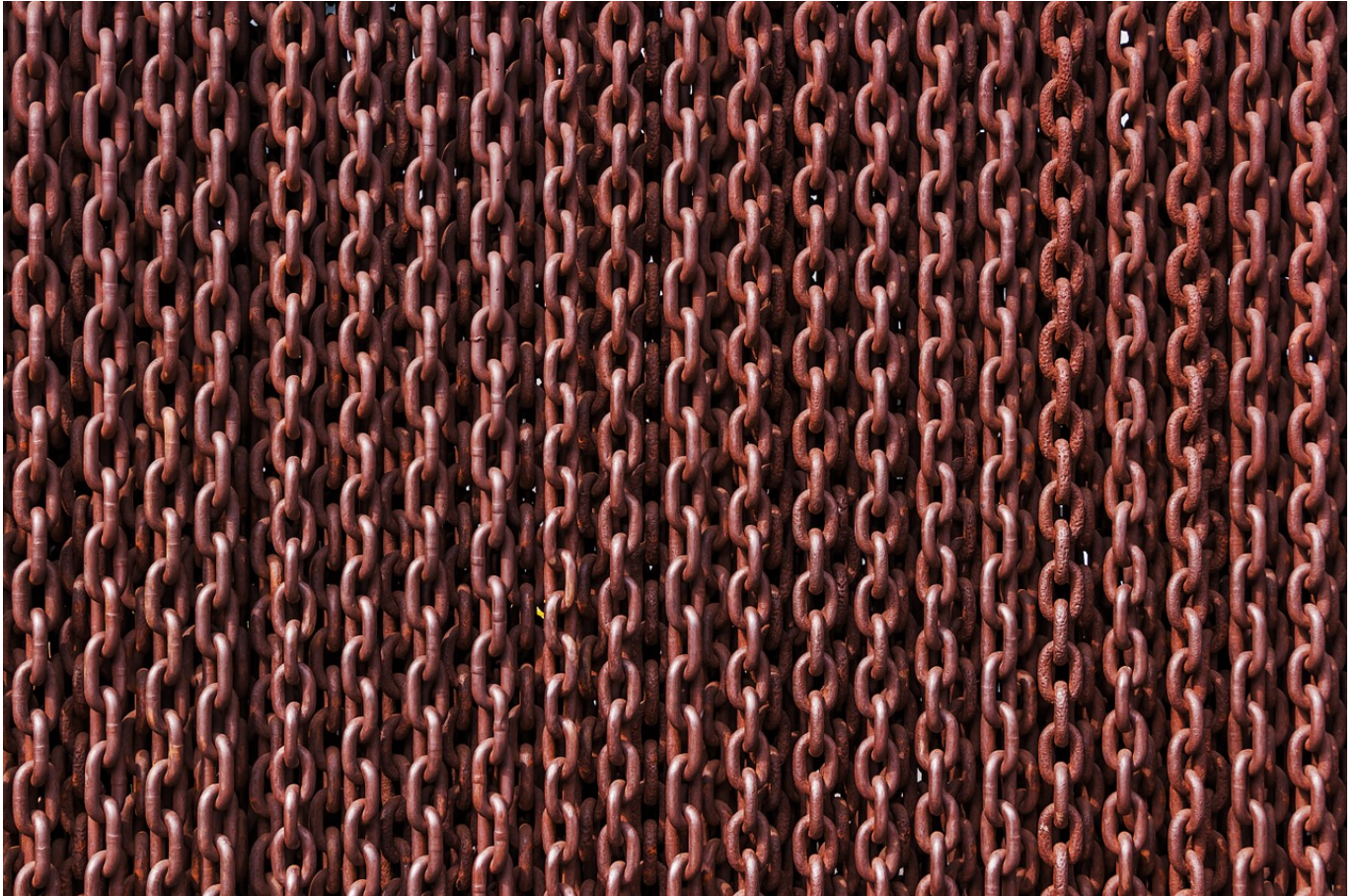

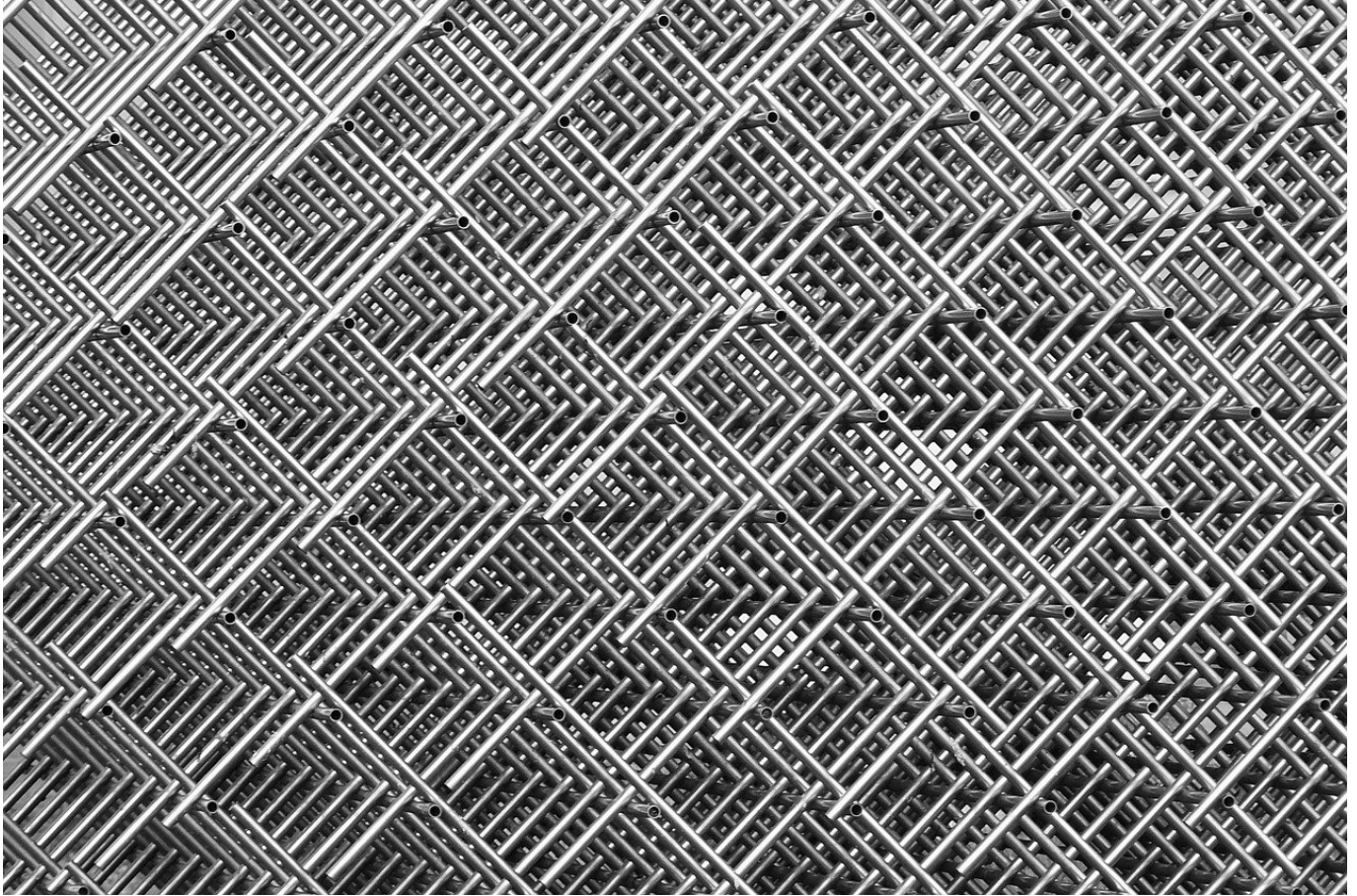

cathode	The negatively charged electrode by which electrons enter an electrical device.

chloride	Any salt of hydrochloric acid containing the chloride ion. <i>The presence of sulphates chlorides and nitrates.</i>
copper	Brown coins of low value made of copper or bronze. <i>She had copper coloured hair.</i>
corrode	(of metal or other materials) be destroyed or damaged slowly by chemical action. <i>The metal corroded.</i>
ferrous	Of or relating to or containing iron.
grate	Furnish with a grate. <i>The buzzing sound grated on her nerves.</i>
hydroxide	A compound of a metal with the hydroxide ion OH as in many alkalis or the group OH.
ion	An atom or molecule with a net electric charge due to the loss or gain of one or more electrons. <i>A sulphate ion.</i>
iron	A meteorite containing a high proportion of iron. <i>The iron grip of the president on every aspect of foreign policy.</i>
lithium	Lithium carbonate or another lithium salt used as a mood stabilizing drug.
manganese	The black dioxide of manganese as an industrial raw material or additive especially in glass making.
metallic	A paint fabric or colour with a metallic sheen. <i>Metallic alloys.</i>
nickel	Plate with nickel. <i>We will see gasoline prices go up about a nickel.</i>
nitrate	Treat with nitric acid so as to change an organic compound into a nitrate. <i>Nitrated polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons.</i>
nitrogen	The chemical element of atomic number 7 a colourless odourless unreactive gas that forms about 78 per cent of the earth's atmosphere. Liquid nitrogen made by distilling liquid air boils at 77.4 kelvins (195.8 C) and is used as a coolant.
oxide	A binary compound of oxygen with another element or group. <i>Nitrogen oxide.</i>

- polymer** A substance which has a molecular structure built up chiefly or completely from a large number of similar units bonded together, e.g. many synthetic organic materials used as plastics and resins.
- potassium** The chemical element of atomic number 19, a soft silvery-white reactive metal of the alkali metal group.
- silicate** Any of the many minerals consisting of silica combined with metal oxides, forming a major component of the rocks of the earth's crust.
- silver** Provide mirror glass with a backing of a silver coloured material in order to make it reflective.
*Her worries had **silvered** her hair.*
- sodium** A silvery soft waxy metallic element of the alkali metal group; occurs abundantly in natural compounds (especially in salt water); burns with a yellow flame and reacts violently in water; occurs in sea water and in the mineral halite (r).
- zinc** Coat or cover with zinc.
*The metal has to be **zinc**ed to prevent oxidation and decay.*
