- Any of several chemical elements that are usually shiny solids that conduct heat or electricity and can be formed into sheets etc.
- A mixture containing two or more metallic elements or metallic and nonmetallic elements usually fused together or dissolving into each other when molten.
- The steel tracks of a railway.

- Gold and silver (as tinctures in blazoning).
- Heavy metal or similar rock music.
- Molten glass before it is blown or cast.






