<u>absenteeism</u>	The practice of regularly staying away from work or school without good reason. High levels of <b>absenteeism</b> caused by low job motivation.
allow	Allow or plan for a certain possibility concede the truth or validity of something. This sealed door won t <b>allow</b> the water come into the basement.
<u>away</u>	An away match or win. He s <b>away</b> right now.
<u>barring</u>	The act of excluding someone by a negative vote or veto.
by	So as to go past. A car flashed <b>by</b> on the other side of the road.
decriminalize	Make legal. A battle to <b>decriminalize</b> cannabis.
defeatist	Demonstrating expectation or acceptance of failure. We have a duty not to be so <b>defeatist</b> .
<u>depart</u>	Leave, especially in order to start a journey. A contingent was <b>depart</b> ing from Cairo.
<u>ease</u>	Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. The boat <b>ease</b> d away from the harbour.
except	Take exception to. Five classes of advertisement are <b>except</b> ed from control.



exception	A person or thing that is excluded from a general statement or does not follow a rule. <i>He always plays top tunes and tonight was no exception.</i>
exclude	Put out or expel from a place. Apply flux to <b>exclude</b> oxygen.
<u>exclusion</u>	An item or eventuality specifically not covered by an insurance policy or other contract. <i>Exclusions</i> can be added to your policy.
exemption	The action of freeing or state of being free from an obligation or liability imposed on others. Additional <b>exemptions</b> are allowed for each dependent.
<u>exhale</u>	Give out (breath or an odor. The jungle <b>exhale</b> d mists of early morning.
facilitate	Make (an action or process) easy or easier. The stimulus <b>facilitate</b> s a delayed impulse.
going	An act of leaving a place; a departure. <i>Persuading him was easy <b>going</b>.</i>
home	At or to or in the direction of one s home or family. <i>He was four fences from <b>home</b></i> .
leave	In snooker croquet and other games the position in which a player leaves the balls for the next player. <i>19 minus 8 leaves 11.</i>
legalize	Make (something that was previously illegal) permissible by law. <i>The Swiss parliament <b>legalize</b>d cannabis.</i>
<u>let</u>	Allow to pass in a particular direction. About 50 people were <b>let</b> into the hearing.
offstage	Situated or taking place in the area of a stage not visible to the audience. <i>The offstage lives of celebrities.</i>
<u>omit</u>	Leave undone or leave out. <i>He modestly</i> <b>omit</b> s to mention that he was a pole vault champion.
other	Denoting the second of a specified or implied group of two. <i>He asked for <b>other</b> employment.</i>
<u>outside</u>	Functioning outside the boundaries or precincts of an organized unit. An <b>outside</b> pitch.
rent	Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. We <b>rent</b> ed our apartment to friends while we were abroad.
