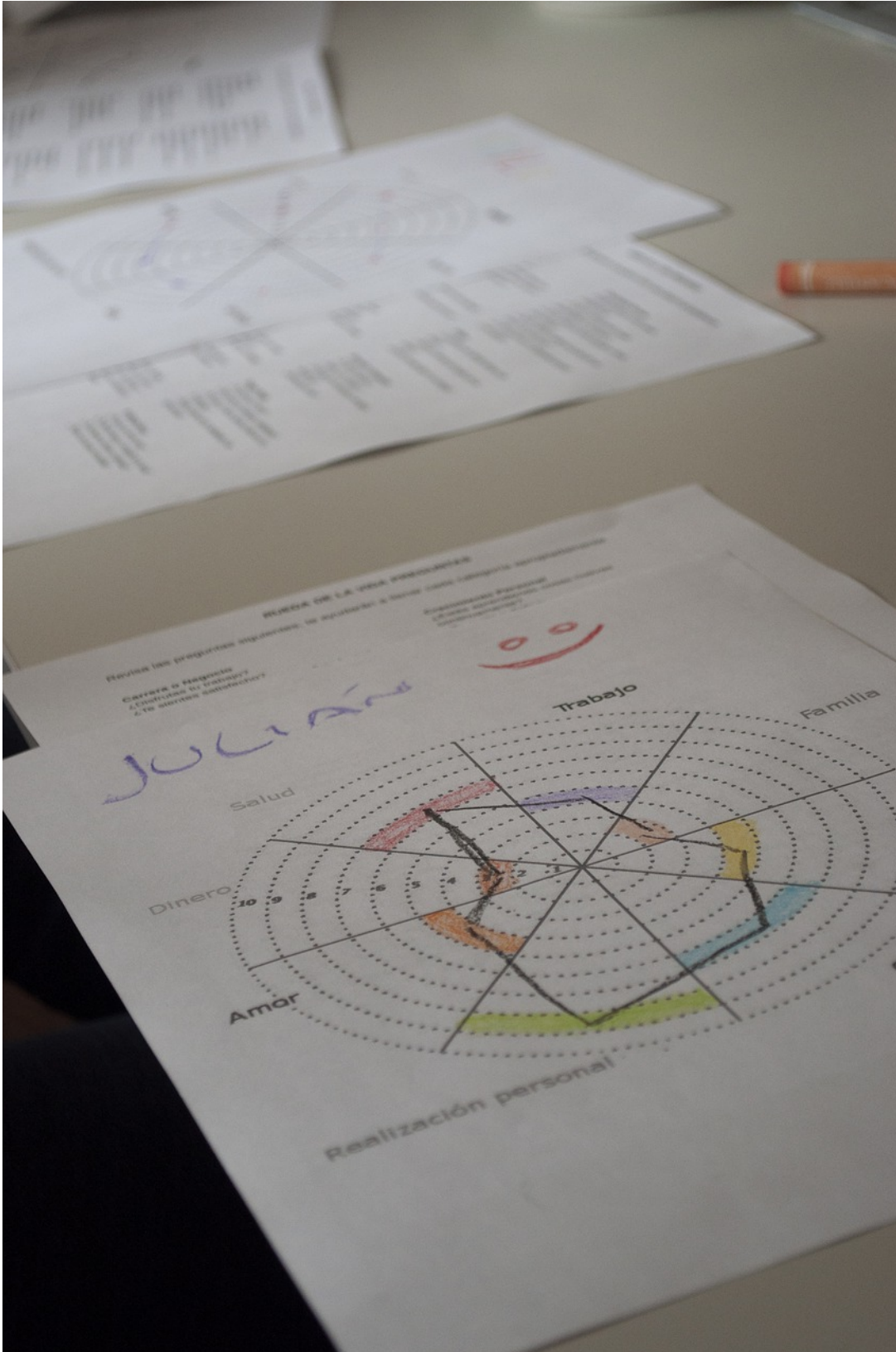

line of action	Something (as a cord or rope) that is long and thin and flexible.
means	How a result is obtained or an end is achieved. <i>Resolving disputes by peaceful means.</i>
measure	Measuring instrument having a sequence of marks at regular intervals used as a reference in making measurements. <i>Children were evacuated as a precautionary measure.</i>
mechanism	The doctrine that all natural phenomena, including life and thought, can be explained with reference to mechanical or chemical processes. <i>The immune system s mechanism for detecting pathogens.</i>
method	The quality of being well organized and systematic in thought or action. <i>A method for software maintenance.</i>
methodological analysis	The system of methods followed in a particular discipline.
mo	An indefinitely short time. <i>Hang on a mo.</i>
modus operandi	An unvarying or habitual method or procedure.
operation	Psychology the performance of some composite cognitive activity an operation that affects mental contents. <i>Her smooth operation of the vehicle gave us a surprisingly comfortable ride.</i>
plan	A drawing or diagram made by projection on a horizontal plane especially one showing the layout of a building or one floor of a building. <i>A street plan.</i>
plan of action	A series of steps to be carried out or goals to be accomplished.

policy	A line of argument rationalizing the course of action of a government. <i>You should have read the small print on your policy.</i>
proceeding	(law) the institution of a sequence of steps by which legal judgments are invoked.
process	A mental process that you are not directly aware of. <i>It was a process of trial and error.</i>
series of steps	A serialized set of programs.
sop	A piece of bread dipped in gravy, soup, or sauce. <i>My agent telephones as a sop but never finds me work.</i>
standard operating procedure	Any distinctive flag.
stratagem	A maneuver in a game or conversation. <i>A series of devious stratagems.</i>
strategy	A plan for directing overall military operations and movements. <i>Time to develop a coherent economic strategy.</i>
system	Organized planning or behaviour; orderliness. <i>Exercise helped him get the alcohol out of his system.</i>
technique	Skill or ability in a particular field. <i>He has excellent technique.</i>
way	A general category of things used in the expression in the way of. <i>The dinghy lost way and drifted towards the shore.</i>

analytical	Relating to or using analysis or logical reasoning. <i>Analytical reasoning.</i>
axiomatic	Self-evident or unquestionable. <i>It is axiomatic that dividends have to be financed.</i>
befitting	Appropriate to the occasion. <i>A country which can run the prestigious tournament in a befitting manner.</i>
capillarity	The tendency of a liquid in a capillary tube or absorbent material to rise or fall as a result of surface tension.
courtly	Refined or imposing in manner or appearance; befitting a royal court. <i>He gave a courtly bow.</i>
deducible	Capable of being deduced.

deductive	Relating to logical deduction. <i>Deductive reasoning.</i>
dialectical	Of or relating to or employing dialectic. <i>The dialectical method.</i>
epistemology	The philosophical theory of knowledge.
formal	Being in accord with established forms and conventions and requirements as e.g. of formal dress. <i>The paper was written in formal English.</i>
generalize	Make a general or broad statement by inferring from specific cases. <i>It is not easy to generalize about the poor.</i>
genetical	Of or relating to or produced by or being a gene.
hypothesis	A proposition made as a basis for reasoning, without any assumption of its truth. <i>A scientific hypothesis that survives experimental testing becomes a scientific theory.</i>
<u>hypothesize</u>	To believe especially on uncertain or tentative grounds. <i>He hypothesized that the black market would naturally die out.</i>
incontrovertible	Not able to be denied or disputed. <i>Incontrovertible proof of the defendant's innocence.</i>
inimitable	So good or unusual as to be impossible to copy; unique. <i>An inimitable style.</i>
logic	The system of operations performed by a computer that underlies the machine's representation of logical operations. <i>Aristotelian logic.</i>
<u>logical</u>	Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>Rain was a logical expectation given the time of year.</i>
manner	Social behaviour or habits. <i>Her dignified manner.</i>
means	Considerable capital (wealth or income). <i>Resolving disputes by peaceful means.</i>
method	The quality of being well organized and systematic in thought or action. <i>Labour intensive production methods.</i>
<u>pejorative</u>	Expressing disapproval. <i>Most of what he said was inflammatory and filled with pejoratives.</i>
philology	Literary or classical scholarship.

postmodern	Relating to or characterized by postmodernism especially in being self referential. <i>Postmodern deconstructionist theories.</i>
procedural	Relating to an established or official way of doing something. <i>A procedural drama set in a Rome police station.</i>
<u>reasoning</u>	Thinking that is coherent and logical. <i>He explained the reasoning behind his decision at a media conference.</i>
relativity	The dependence of various physical phenomena on relative motion of the observer and the observed objects, especially regarding the nature and behaviour of light, space, time, and gravity. <i>Moral relativity.</i>
syllogism	An instance of a form of reasoning in which a conclusion is drawn from two given or assumed propositions (premises); a common or middle term is present in the two premises but not in the conclusion, which may be invalid (e.g. all dogs are animals; all animals have four legs; therefore all dogs have four legs). <i>This school of epistemology is highly advanced in syllogism and logical reasoning.</i>
teleology	The explanation of phenomena in terms of the purpose they serve rather than of the cause by which they arise. <i>His theory of class consciousness is predicated on a teleology.</i>
<u>theory</u>	A tentative insight into the natural world; a concept that is not yet verified but that if true would explain certain facts or phenomena. <i>Music theory.</i>
