accurate	Of an instrument or method capable of giving accurate information. <i>The accounting was accurate.</i>
<u>careful</u>	Cautiously attentive. <i>Careful art restorers.</i>
conscientious	Relating to a person's conscience. <i>Conscientious application to the work at hand.</i>
correct	Correct in opinion or judgment. <i>Correct behavior.</i>
demanding	(of a task) requiring much skill or effort. <i>A baby can be so demanding.</i>
diligent	Having or showing care and conscientiousness in one's work or duties. <i>After diligent searching he found a parcel.</i>

exacting

Having complicated nutritional requirements; especially growing only in special artificial cultures.

An **exacting** instructor.

painstaking

Characterized by extreme care and great effort.

Painstaking research.

punctilious

Marked by precise accordance with details.

Punctilious in his attention to rules of etiquette.

scrupulous

Having scruples; arising from a sense of right and wrong; principled.

She s too **scrupulous** to have an affair with a married man.

assiduity	Great and constant diligence and attention. <i>The assiduity with which he could wear down his opponents.</i>
<u>assiduous</u>	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>Her assiduous attempts to learn French.</i>
<u>busy</u>	Unavailable for use by anyone else or indicating unavailability engaged is a British term for a busy telephone line. <i>The team members are busy raising money.</i>
<u>careful</u>	Unhurried and with care and dignity. <i>Careful of the rights of others.</i>
conscientious	Guided by or in accordance with conscience or sense of right and wrong. <i>Conscientious application to the work at hand.</i>
detailed	(of a work of art) executed with many minor decorative features. <i>More detailed information was needed.</i>
<u>diligence</u>	Careful and persistent work or effort. <i>His diligence won him quick promotions.</i>
diligent	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>After diligent searching he found a parcel.</i>
<u>exact</u>	Demand and obtain (something) from someone. <i>An exact copy.</i>
exacting	Having complicated nutritional requirements; especially growing only in special artificial cultures. <i>An exacting job.</i>
exactitude	Care and attention to detail. <i>He writes with exactitude and precision.</i>
<u>fastidious</u>	Giving careful attention to detail; hard to please; excessively concerned with cleanliness. <i>Fastidious about personal cleanliness.</i>
<u>finicky</u>	(of a person) fussy about their needs or requirements. <i>A finicky eater.</i>
fussy	Annoyed and irritable. <i>I hate fussy clothes.</i>
hardworking	Characterized by hard work and perseverance.
<u>industrious</u>	Working hard to promote an enterprise. <i>An industrious people striving to make their country prosperous.</i>

<u>painstaking</u>	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>Painstaking research.</i>
painstakingly	With great care and thoroughness. <i>The property has been painstakingly restored by its current owners.</i>
pedantic	Marked by a narrow focus on or display of learning especially its trivial aspects. <i>His analyses are careful and even painstaking but never pedantic.</i>
<u>picky</u>	Exacting especially about details. <i>They are becoming increasingly picky about where they stay.</i>
plodding	Slow and laborious. <i>A plodding comedy drama.</i>
<u>precise</u>	(of a person) exact, accurate, and careful about details. <i>A precise measurement.</i>
priggish	Self-righteously moralistic and superior. <i>A priggish little pedant.</i>
prissy	Exaggeratedly proper. <i>A middle class family with two prissy children.</i>
puritanical	Of or relating to Puritans or Puritanism. <i>His puritanical parents saw any kind of pleasure as the road to damnation.</i>
scrupulous	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>Less scrupulous producers sent bundles that were deceptive in appearance.</i>
sedulous	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>He watched himself with the most sedulous care.</i>
stickler	Someone who insists on something. <i>I m a stickler when it comes to timekeeping.</i>
<u>studious</u>	Spending a lot of time studying or reading. <i>He was quiet and studious.</i>
working	(of parts of a machine) moving and causing a machine to operate. <i>Working with animals teaches patience.</i>
