| cosmography | A representation of the earth or the heavens. <i>He published a series of elementary textbooks on cosmography trigonometry and astronomy 1651.</i> |
| cosmology | The science of the origin and development of the universe Modern cosmology is dominated by the Big Bang theory which brings together observational astronomy and particle physics. |
| cosmos | Any of various mostly Mexican herbs of the genus Cosmos having radiate heads of variously colored flowers and pinnate leaves; popular fall-blooming annuals. <i>He sat staring deep into the void reminding himself of man s place in the cosmos.</i> |
| duplicate | Make a duplicate or duplicates of. <i>Could you please duplicate this letter for me.</i> |
| emulate | Match or surpass (a person or achievement), typically by imitation. <i>This artist s drawings cannot emulate his water colors.</i> |

| experiment | A course of action tentatively adopted without being sure of the outcome. <i>The previous experiment in liberal democracy had ended in disaster.</i> |
| facsimile | Send something via a facsimile machine. <i>The ride was facsimiled for another theme park.</i> |
| imitate | Take or follow as a model. <i>Life imitate art.</i> |
| macrocosm | The whole of a complex structure, especially the world or the universe, contrasted with a small or representative part of it. |
| observing | Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception. |
| physicist | A scientist trained in physics. |
| relativity | (physics) the theory that space and time are relative concepts rather than absolute concepts. <i>Moral relativity.</i> |
| <u>replica</u> | A duplicate of an original artistic work. <i>A replica of the Empire State Building.</i> |
| <u>replicate</u> | (of genetic material or a living organism) reproduce or give rise to a copy of itself. <i>These findings have been replicated by Metzger and Antes.</i> |
| reproduce | Make a copy or equivalent of. <i>This DVD player reproduces the sound of the piano very well.</i> |
| sidereal | Of or with respect to the distant stars (i.e. the constellations or fixed stars, not the sun or planets). |
| spacecraft | A vehicle used for travelling in space. |
| spaceman | A person trained to travel in a spacecraft. |
| spaceship | A spacecraft, especially one controlled by a crew. |
| telescope | Make smaller or shorter. <i>A large portion of the past had to be telescoped and summarized for her.</i> |
| triplicate | Reproduce threefold. <i>Titles which have been sparingly ordered can be later duplicated or triplicated.</i> |
| <u>universal</u> | A universal proposition. <i>The incidents caused universal concern.</i> |
| <u>universe</u> | All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>They study the evolution of the universe.</i> |
