<a href="#">astronaut</a>	A person who is trained to travel in a spacecraft. <i>The Russians called their <b>astronauts</b> cosmonauts.</i>
<b>astronomer</b>	An expert in or student of astronomy.
<a href="#">astronomical</a>	Relating to astronomy. <i>He wanted an <b>astronomical</b> fee.</i>
<b>astronomy</b>	The branch of physics that studies celestial bodies and the universe as a whole.
<b>copy</b>	Copy down as is. <i>This is Edwards do you <b>copy</b> over.</i>
<b>cosmogony</b>	The branch of astrophysics that studies the origin and evolution and structure of the universe. <i>In their <b>cosmogony</b> the world was thought to be a square flat surface.</i>
<b>cosmography</b>	A representation of the earth or the heavens. <i>He published a series of elementary textbooks on <b>cosmography</b> trigonometry and astronomy 1651.</i>
<b>cosmology</b>	The science of the origin and development of the universe Modern cosmology is dominated by the Big Bang theory which brings together observational astronomy and particle physics.
<a href="#">cosmos</a>	Any of various mostly Mexican herbs of the genus Cosmos having radiate heads of variously colored flowers and pinnate leaves; popular fall-blooming annuals. <i>He sat staring deep into the void reminding himself of man s place in the <b>cosmos</b>.</i>
<a href="#">duplicate</a>	Make a duplicate or duplicates of. <i>Could you please <b>duplicate</b> this letter for me.</i>
<a href="#">emulate</a>	Match or surpass (a person or achievement), typically by imitation. <i>This artist s drawings cannot <b>emulate</b> his water colors.</i>

<b>experiment</b>	A course of action tentatively adopted without being sure of the outcome. <i>The previous <b>experiment</b> in liberal democracy had ended in disaster.</i>
<b>facsimile</b>	Send something via a facsimile machine. <i>The ride was <b>facsimiled</b> for another theme park.</i>
<b>imitate</b>	Take or follow as a model. <i>Life <b>imitate</b> art.</i>
<b>macrocosm</b>	The whole of a complex structure, especially the world or the universe, contrasted with a small or representative part of it.
<b>observing</b>	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
<b>physicist</b>	A scientist trained in physics.
<b>relativity</b>	(physics) the theory that space and time are relative concepts rather than absolute concepts. <i>Moral <b>relativity</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">replica</a></u>	A duplicate of an original artistic work. <i>A <b>replica</b> of the Empire State Building.</i>
<u><a href="#">replicate</a></u>	(of genetic material or a living organism) reproduce or give rise to a copy of itself. <i>These findings have been <b>replicated</b> by Metzger and Antes.</i>
<b>reproduce</b>	Make a copy or equivalent of. <i>This DVD player <b>reproduces</b> the sound of the piano very well.</i>
<b>sidereal</b>	Of or with respect to the distant stars (i.e. the constellations or fixed stars, not the sun or planets).
<b>spacecraft</b>	A vehicle used for travelling in space.
<b>spaceman</b>	A person trained to travel in a spacecraft.
<b>spaceship</b>	A spacecraft, especially one controlled by a crew.
<b>telescope</b>	Make smaller or shorter. <i>A large portion of the past had to be <b>telescoped</b> and summarized for her.</i>
<b>triplicate</b>	Reproduce threefold. <i>Titles which have been sparingly ordered can be later duplicated or <b>triplicated</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">universal</a></u>	A universal proposition. <i>The incidents caused <b>universal</b> concern.</i>
<u><a href="#">universe</a></u>	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>They study the evolution of the <b>universe</b>.</i>
