ability	Possession of the means or skill to do something. <i>A man of exceptional ability.</i>
able	Having considerable skill proficiency or intelligence. <i>Human beings are able to walk on two feet.</i>
ardor	Feelings of great warmth and intensity. <i>They were imbued with a revolutionary ardor.</i>
brawn	Physical strength in contrast to intelligence. <i>Commando work required as much brain as brawn.</i>
capability	Forces or resources giving a country the ability to undertake a particular kind of military action. <i>Their nuclear weapons capability.</i>

capable	Having the requisite qualities for. <i>Capable of hard work.</i>
clout	A long distance shot that hits a clout. <i>I gave him a clout on his nose.</i>
coercive	Relating to or using force or threats. <i>Coercive measures.</i>
competent	(of a person) efficient and capable. <i>A competent typist.</i>
domineer	Assert one's will over another in an arrogant way. <i>She doesn't domineer preferring to lead by inspiration rather than by intimidation.</i>
energetic	Showing or involving great activity or vitality. <i>Energetic X rays.</i>
inertia	A property of matter by which it continues in its existing state of rest or uniform motion in a straight line, unless that state is changed by an external force. <i>The thermal inertia of the oceans will delay the full rise in temperature for a few decades.</i>
intensity	The magnitude of sound (usually in a specified direction). <i>Hydrothermal processes of low intensity.</i>
jump	An obstacle to be jumped especially by a horse and rider in an equestrian competition. <i>One of the deer tried to jump the ditch.</i>
loudness	The magnitude of sound (usually in a specified direction).
mighty	Extremely. <i>The mighty logger Paul Bunyan.</i>
mogul	A member of the Muslim dynasty that ruled India until 1857. <i>The Hollywood movie mogul Sam Goldwyn.</i>
musculature	The muscular system of an organism. <i>The speech musculature.</i>
potency	A capacity in embryonic tissue for developing into a particular specialized tissue or organ. <i>A myth of enormous potency.</i>
potential	The possibility of something happening or of someone doing something in the future. <i>A campaign to woo potential customers.</i>

potentiality	The inherent capacity for coming into being. <i>The technology is still relatively not well known in spite of its great potentiality.</i>
potentially	With the capacity to develop or happen in the future. <i>A potentially dangerous situation.</i>
power	One possessing or exercising power or influence or authority. <i>Power cables.</i>
prince	The son of a monarch. <i>Arctic char is a prince among fishes.</i>
puissance	Great power, influence, or prowess. <i>The puissance of the labor vote.</i>
strength	Permanence by virtue of the power to resist stress or force. <i>The strength of the argument for property taxation.</i>
<u>subconsciously</u>	In a way that is influenced by the part of the mind of which one is not fully aware. <i>Maybe subconsciously I was trying to sabotage the deal.</i>
superhuman	Above or beyond the human or demanding more than human power or endurance. <i>Superhuman strength.</i>
tycoon	A title applied by foreigners to the shogun of Japan in power between 1857 and 1868. <i>A newspaper tycoon.</i>
<u>vehement</u>	Characterized by great force or energy. <i>Vehement dislike.</i>
