**mightiness** Physical strength.

**power** A very wealthy or powerful businessman.  
*The **powers** of darkness.*

- ability** Possession of the means or skill to do something.  
*A man of exceptional **ability**.*
- able** Having considerable skill proficiency or intelligence.  
*Human beings are **able** to walk on two feet.*
- ardor** Feelings of great warmth and intensity.  
*They were imbued with a revolutionary **ardor**.*
- brawn** Physical strength in contrast to intelligence.  
*Commando work required as much brain as **brawn**.*
- capability** Forces or resources giving a country the ability to undertake a particular kind of military action.  
*Their nuclear weapons **capability**.*

<b>capable</b>	Having the requisite qualities for. <i><b>Capable</b> of hard work.</i>
<b>clout</b>	A long distance shot that hits a clout. <i>I gave him a <b>clout</b> on his nose.</i>
<b>coercive</b>	Relating to or using force or threats. <i><b>Coercive</b> measures.</i>
<b>competent</b>	(of a person) efficient and capable. <i>A <b>competent</b> typist.</i>
<b>domineer</b>	Assert one's will over another in an arrogant way. <i>She doesn't <b>domineer</b> preferring to lead by inspiration rather than by intimidation.</i>
<b>energetic</b>	Showing or involving great activity or vitality. <i><b>Energetic</b> X rays.</i>
<b>inertia</b>	A property of matter by which it continues in its existing state of rest or uniform motion in a straight line, unless that state is changed by an external force. <i>The thermal <b>inertia</b> of the oceans will delay the full rise in temperature for a few decades.</i>
<b>intensity</b>	The magnitude of sound (usually in a specified direction). <i>Hydrothermal processes of low <b>intensity</b>.</i>
<b>jump</b>	An obstacle to be jumped especially by a horse and rider in an equestrian competition. <i>One of the deer tried to <b>jump</b> the ditch.</i>
<b>loudness</b>	The magnitude of sound (usually in a specified direction).
<b>mighty</b>	Extremely. <i>The <b>mighty</b> logger Paul Bunyan.</i>
<b>mogul</b>	A member of the Muslim dynasty that ruled India until 1857. <i>The Hollywood movie <b>mogul</b> Sam Goldwyn.</i>
<b>musculature</b>	The muscular system of an organism. <i>The speech <b>musculature</b>.</i>
<b>potency</b>	A capacity in embryonic tissue for developing into a particular specialized tissue or organ. <i>A myth of enormous <b>potency</b>.</i>
<b>potential</b>	The possibility of something happening or of someone doing something in the future. <i>A campaign to woo <b>potential</b> customers.</i>

<b>potentiality</b>	The inherent capacity for coming into being. <i>The technology is still relatively not well known in spite of its great <b>potentiality</b>.</i>
<b>potentially</b>	With the capacity to develop or happen in the future. <i>A <b>potentially</b> dangerous situation.</i>
<b>power</b>	One possessing or exercising power or influence or authority. <i><b>Power</b> cables.</i>
<b>prince</b>	The son of a monarch. <i>Arctic char is a <b>prince</b> among fishes.</i>
<b>puissance</b>	Great power, influence, or prowess. <i>The <b>puissance</b> of the labor vote.</i>
<b>strength</b>	Permanence by virtue of the power to resist stress or force. <i>The <b>strength</b> of the argument for property taxation.</i>
<b><u>subconsciously</u></b>	In a way that is influenced by the part of the mind of which one is not fully aware. <i>Maybe <b>subconsciously</b> I was trying to sabotage the deal.</i>
<b>superhuman</b>	Above or beyond the human or demanding more than human power or endurance. <i><b>Superhuman</b> strength.</i>
<b>tycoon</b>	A title applied by foreigners to the shogun of Japan in power between 1857 and 1868. <i>A newspaper <b>tycoon</b>.</i>
<b><u>vehement</u></b>	Characterized by great force or energy. <i><b>Vehement</b> dislike.</i>
