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| abundantly | In large quantities; plentifully. <i>My boss made it abundantly clear that if I didn't like it I should look for another job.</i> |
| all out | To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’). |

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| assiduously | With great care and perseverance. <i>Leaders worked assiduously to hammer out an action plan.</i> |
| <u>conscientiously</u> | With extreme conscientiousness. <i>He could not conscientiously take the oath.</i> |
| diligently | With diligence; in a diligent manner. <i>I searched diligently for a remedy.</i> |
| <u>eagerly</u> | In a keenly expectant or interested manner. <i>Fans of the show are eagerly awaiting the new season.</i> |
| <u>earnestly</u> | With sincere and intense conviction; seriously. <i>Talking earnestly with his son.</i> |
| energetically | In an energetic manner. <i>The royal pair were dancing energetically.</i> |
| <u>enormously</u> | Extremely. <i>Quality of life varies enormously from one place to another.</i> |
| enthusiastically | In a lavish or enthusiastic manner. <i>The audience applauded enthusiastically.</i> |
| <u>exceedingly</u> | To a great extent. <i>The supply multiplied exceedingly.</i> |
| extremely | To a very great degree; very. <i>Extremely cold.</i> |
| <u>fiercely</u> | In a powerful and destructive manner. <i>The army clashed fiercely with militants.</i> |
| forcefully | In a strong and assertive manner; vigorously. <i>Exhale forcefully through your nose.</i> |
| <u>forcibly</u> | Using force or violence. <i>They argued forcibly against the proposal.</i> |
| hard | Causing great damage or hardship. <i>Held hard to the railing.</i> |
| heartily | To a great degree; very (especially with reference to personal feelings). <i>She laughed heartily.</i> |
| <u>heavily</u> | In a manner designed for heavy duty. <i>He relied heavily on others data.</i> |
| hugely | Very much; to a very great extent. <i>A hugely expensive house.</i> |

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| immensely | To a great extent; extremely. <i>Was immensely more important to the project as a scientist than as an administrator.</i> |
| indefatigably | With indefatigable energy. <i>She watched the show indefatigably.</i> |
| intensely | In an intense manner. <i>She intensely disliked any form of confrontation.</i> |
| markedly | To an extent which is clearly noticeable; significantly. <i>New diagnoses have increased markedly since 1998.</i> |
| mighty | (Southern regional intensive) very; to a great degree. <i>He s mighty tired.</i> |
| persistently | With persistence. <i>The rules are persistently flouted.</i> |
| powerful | (Southern regional intensive) very; to a great degree. <i>It is powerful humid.</i> |
| powerfully | In a powerful manner. <i>The federal government replaced the powerfully pro settler Sir Godfrey Huggins with the even tougher and more determined ex trade unionist.</i> |
| remarkably | In a signal manner. <i>You have performed remarkably.</i> |
| right | On or to the right side. <i>They have a right nice place.</i> |
| strenuously | In a way that requires great physical exertion. <i>He strenuously denied any wrongdoing.</i> |
| tremendously | Extremely. <i>A tremendously exciting opportunity.</i> |
| vastly | To an exceedingly great extent or degree. <i>Business practices differ vastly from country to country.</i> |
| vigorously | In a way that involves physical strength, effort, or energy; strenuously. <i>He vigorously denied the allegation.</i> |
| with all one's might | To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (`whole' is often used informally for `wholly). |
