- *(Southern regional intensive) very; to a great degree.*
- *Powerfully or vigorously.*

### Synonyms of "Mightily" as an adverb (34 Words)

<b>abundantly</b>	In large quantities; plentifully. <i>My boss made it <b>abundantly</b> clear that if I didn't like it I should look for another job.</i>
<b>all out</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’).

<b>assiduously</b>	With great care and perseverance. <i>Leaders worked <b>assiduously</b> to hammer out an action plan.</i>
<b><u>conscientiously</u></b>	With extreme conscientiousness. <i>He could not <b>conscientiously</b> take the oath.</i>
<b>diligently</b>	With diligence; in a diligent manner. <i>I searched <b>diligently</b> for a remedy.</i>
<b><u>eagerly</u></b>	In a keenly expectant or interested manner. <i>Fans of the show are <b>eagerly</b> awaiting the new season.</i>
<b><u>earnestly</u></b>	With sincere and intense conviction; seriously. <i>Talking <b>earnestly</b> with his son.</i>
<b>energetically</b>	In an energetic manner. <i>The royal pair were dancing <b>energetically</b>.</i>
<b><u>enormously</u></b>	Extremely. <i>Quality of life varies <b>enormously</b> from one place to another.</i>
<b>enthusiastically</b>	In a lavish or enthusiastic manner. <i>The audience applauded <b>enthusiastically</b>.</i>
<b><u>exceedingly</u></b>	To a great extent. <i>The supply multiplied <b>exceedingly</b>.</i>
<b>extremely</b>	To a very great degree; very. <i><b>Extremely</b> cold.</i>
<b><u>fiercely</u></b>	In a powerful and destructive manner. <i>The army clashed <b>fiercely</b> with militants.</i>
<b>forcefully</b>	In a strong and assertive manner; vigorously. <i>Exhale <b>forcefully</b> through your nose.</i>
<b><u>forcibly</u></b>	Using force or violence. <i>They argued <b>forcibly</b> against the proposal.</i>
<b>hard</b>	Causing great damage or hardship. <i>Held <b>hard</b> to the railing.</i>
<b>heartily</b>	To a great degree; very (especially with reference to personal feelings). <i>She laughed <b>heartily</b>.</i>
<b><u>heavily</u></b>	In a manner designed for heavy duty. <i>He relied <b>heavily</b> on others data.</i>
<b>hugely</b>	Very much; to a very great extent. <i>A <b>hugely</b> expensive house.</i>

<b>immensely</b>	To a great extent; extremely. <i>Was <b>immensely</b> more important to the project as a scientist than as an administrator.</i>
<b>indefatigably</b>	With indefatigable energy. <i>She watched the show <b>indefatigably</b>.</i>
<b>intensely</b>	In an intense manner. <i>She <b>intensely</b> disliked any form of confrontation.</i>
<b>markedly</b>	To an extent which is clearly noticeable; significantly. <i>New diagnoses have increased <b>markedly</b> since 1998.</i>
<b>mighty</b>	(Southern regional intensive) very; to a great degree. <i>He s <b>mighty</b> tired.</i>
<b>persistently</b>	With persistence. <i>The rules are <b>persistently</b> flouted.</i>
<b>powerful</b>	(Southern regional intensive) very; to a great degree. <i>It is <b>powerful</b> humid.</i>
<b>powerfully</b>	In a powerful manner. <i>The federal government replaced the <b>powerfully</b> pro settler Sir Godfrey Huggins with the even tougher and more determined ex trade unionist.</i>
<b>remarkably</b>	In a signal manner. <i>You have performed <b>remarkably</b>.</i>
<b>right</b>	On or to the right side. <i>They have a <b>right</b> nice place.</i>
<b>strenuously</b>	In a way that requires great physical exertion. <i>He <b>strenuously</b> denied any wrongdoing.</i>
<b>tremendously</b>	Extremely. <i>A <b>tremendously</b> exciting opportunity.</i>
<b>vastly</b>	To an exceedingly great extent or degree. <i>Business practices differ <b>vastly</b> from country to country.</i>
<b>vigorously</b>	In a way that involves physical strength, effort, or energy; strenuously. <i>He <b>vigorously</b> denied the allegation.</i>
<b>with all one's might</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent ( `whole' is often used informally for `wholly).
