<u>aboard</u>	On base as a runner. Anchored close aboard another ship.

<u>aircraft</u>	A vehicle that can fly.
ambulatory	Relating to or adapted for walking. Five similar pairs of ambulatory legs.
ballooning	Flying in a balloon. He took up ballooning in 1907.
continental	An inhabitant of mainland Europe. <i>Continental</i> Europe.
cruise	Drive around aimlessly but ostentatiously and at leisure. He cruise d the gay bars of Los Angeles.
disembarkation	The act of passengers and crew getting off of a ship or aircraft.
<u>drift</u>	Be in motion due to some air or water current. I noticed my audience s attention drift ing.
embark	Put or take on board a ship or aircraft. The passengers were ready to be embark ed.
gallivant	Wander aimlessly in search of pleasure. She quit her job to go gallivant ing around the globe.
go	Vigorous activity. We ve a long way to go .
<u>international</u>	A player who has taken part in an international game or contest. An international agreement.
itinerate	Travel from place to place, as for work. <i>Regular use of itinerating magistrates was made.</i>



maneuverable	Capable of maneuvering or changing position. A highly maneuverable ship.
migration	The periodic passage of groups of animals (especially birds or fishes) from one region to another for feeding or breeding. <i>This butterfly s annual migration across North America.</i>
migratory	Relating to animal migration. The migratory route for whale sharks.
mobile	A mobile phone. A mobile missile system.
<u>mobility</u>	The ability to move or be moved freely and easily. This exercise helps retain mobility in the damaged joints.
move	Cause to move or shift into a new position or place both in a concrete and in an abstract sense. The school move d over to the new course in 1987.
navigation	The passage of ships. Most of the navigation from Wormley to Tottenham was frozen.
nomadic	Migratory. The nomadic habits of the Bedouins.
roam	Use a mobile phone on another operator's network, typically while abroad. <i>The gypsies roamed the woods.</i>
roving	(of a person in relation to their job) travelling or required to travel to different locations. Roving bands of armed protesters.
transferable	Legally transferable to the ownership of another. Transferable skills.
transit	Revolve the telescope of a surveying transit about its horizontal transverse axis in order to reverse its direction. At the end of February Jupiter transit s the meridian.
transnational	Involving or operating in several nations or nationalities. <i>Transnational</i> terrorist networks.
travel	Travel from place to place as for the purpose of finding work preaching or acting as a judge. <i>Two proximity switches detect when the valve has reached the end of its</i> <i>travel</i> .
trip	Make a trip for pleasure. Trip s and falls cause nearly half of all accidents.
