Associations of "Migrating" (30 Words)

aboard	On base as a runner. <i>Anchored close aboard another ship.</i>
airborne	(of an aircraft) in the air after taking off. <i>The shuttle was airborne.</i>
aircraft	A vehicle that can fly.
ambulatory	Relating to or adapted for walking. <i>Five similar pairs of ambulatory legs.</i>
ballooning	Flying in a balloon. <i>He took up ballooning in 1907.</i>
continental	An inhabitant of mainland Europe. <i>Continental Europe.</i>
cruise	Drive around aimlessly but ostentatiously and at leisure. <i>He cruised the gay bars of Los Angeles.</i>
disembarkation	The act of passengers and crew getting off of a ship or aircraft.
drift	Be in motion due to some air or water current. <i>I noticed my audience's attention drifting.</i>
embark	Put or take on board a ship or aircraft. <i>The passengers were ready to be embarked.</i>
gallivant	Wander aimlessly in search of pleasure. <i>She quit her job to go gallivanting around the globe.</i>
go	Vigorous activity. <i>We've a long way to go.</i>
international	A player who has taken part in an international game or contest. <i>An international agreement.</i>
itinerate	Travel from place to place, as for work. <i>Regular use of itinerating magistrates was made.</i>

maneuverable	Capable of maneuvering or changing position. <i>A highly maneuverable ship.</i>
migration	The periodic passage of groups of animals (especially birds or fishes) from one region to another for feeding or breeding. <i>This butterfly's annual migration across North America.</i>
migratory	Relating to animal migration. <i>The migratory route for whale sharks.</i>
mobile	A mobile phone. <i>A mobile missile system.</i>
mobility	The ability to move or be moved freely and easily. <i>This exercise helps retain mobility in the damaged joints.</i>
move	Cause to move or shift into a new position or place both in a concrete and in an abstract sense. <i>The school moved over to the new course in 1987.</i>
navigation	The passage of ships. <i>Most of the navigation from Wormley to Tottenham was frozen.</i>
nomadic	Migratory. <i>The nomadic habits of the Bedouins.</i>
roam	Use a mobile phone on another operator's network, typically while abroad. <i>The gypsies roamed the woods.</i>
roving	(of a person in relation to their job) travelling or required to travel to different locations. <i>Roving bands of armed protesters.</i>
transferable	Legally transferable to the ownership of another. <i>Transferable skills.</i>
transit	Revolve the telescope of a surveying transit about its horizontal transverse axis in order to reverse its direction. <i>At the end of February Jupiter transits the meridian.</i>
transnational	Involving or operating in several nations or nationalities. <i>Transnational terrorist networks.</i>
travel	Travel from place to place as for the purpose of finding work preaching or acting as a judge. <i>Two proximity switches detect when the valve has reached the end of its travel.</i>
trip	Make a trip for pleasure. <i>Trips and falls cause nearly half of all accidents.</i>
