## Associations of "Migrating" (30 Words)

<a href="#">aboard</a>	On base as a runner. <i>Anchored close <b>aboard</b> another ship.</i>
<a href="#">airborne</a>	(of an aircraft) in the air after taking off. <i>The shuttle was <b>airborne</b>.</i>
<a href="#">aircraft</a>	A vehicle that can fly.
<b>ambulatory</b>	Relating to or adapted for walking. <i>Five similar pairs of <b>ambulatory</b> legs.</i>
<b>ballooning</b>	Flying in a balloon. <i>He took up <b>ballooning</b> in 1907.</i>
<b>continental</b>	An inhabitant of mainland Europe. <i><b>Continental</b> Europe.</i>
<b>cruise</b>	Drive around aimlessly but ostentatiously and at leisure. <i>He <b>cruised</b> the gay bars of Los Angeles.</i>
<b>disembarkation</b>	The act of passengers and crew getting off of a ship or aircraft.
<a href="#">drift</a>	Be in motion due to some air or water current. <i>I noticed my audience's attention <b>drifting</b>.</i>
<b>embark</b>	Put or take on board a ship or aircraft. <i>The passengers were ready to be <b>embarked</b>.</i>
<b>gallivant</b>	Wander aimlessly in search of pleasure. <i>She quit her job to go <b>gallivanting</b> around the globe.</i>
<b>go</b>	Vigorous activity. <i>We've a long way to <b>go</b>.</i>
<a href="#">international</a>	A player who has taken part in an international game or contest. <i>An <b>international</b> agreement.</i>
<b>itinerate</b>	Travel from place to place, as for work. <i>Regular use of <b>itinerating</b> magistrates was made.</i>

<b>maneuverable</b>	Capable of maneuvering or changing position. <i>A highly <b>maneuverable</b> ship.</i>
<b>migration</b>	The periodic passage of groups of animals (especially birds or fishes) from one region to another for feeding or breeding. <i>This butterfly's annual <b>migration</b> across North America.</i>
<b>migratory</b>	Relating to animal migration. <i>The <b>migratory</b> route for whale sharks.</i>
<b>mobile</b>	A mobile phone. <i>A <b>mobile</b> missile system.</i>
<b>mobility</b>	The ability to move or be moved freely and easily. <i>This exercise helps retain <b>mobility</b> in the damaged joints.</i>
<b>move</b>	Cause to move or shift into a new position or place both in a concrete and in an abstract sense. <i>The school <b>moved</b> over to the new course in 1987.</i>
<b>navigation</b>	The passage of ships. <i>Most of the <b>navigation</b> from Wormley to Tottenham was frozen.</i>
<b>nomadic</b>	Migratory. <i>The <b>nomadic</b> habits of the Bedouins.</i>
<b>roam</b>	Use a mobile phone on another operator's network, typically while abroad. <i>The gypsies <b>roamed</b> the woods.</i>
<b>roving</b>	(of a person in relation to their job) travelling or required to travel to different locations. <i><b>Roving</b> bands of armed protesters.</i>
<b>transferable</b>	Legally transferable to the ownership of another. <i><b>Transferable</b> skills.</i>
<b>transit</b>	Revolve the telescope of a surveying transit about its horizontal transverse axis in order to reverse its direction. <i>At the end of February Jupiter <b>transits</b> the meridian.</i>
<b>transnational</b>	Involving or operating in several nations or nationalities. <i><b>Transnational</b> terrorist networks.</i>
<b>travel</b>	Travel from place to place as for the purpose of finding work preaching or acting as a judge. <i>Two proximity switches detect when the valve has reached the end of its <b>travel</b>.</i>
<b>trip</b>	Make a trip for pleasure. <i><b>Trips</b> and falls cause nearly half of all accidents.</i>
