Associations of "Mild mannered" (30 Words)

amiable	Diffusing warmth and friendliness. <i>The amiable young man greeted me enthusiastically.</i>
balmy	Mild and pleasant. <i>The balmy days of late summer.</i>
clement	Inclined to show mercy. <i>A more clement judge reduced the sentence.</i>
condescendingly	With condescension; in a patronizing manner. <i>He treats his secretary condescendingly.</i>
considerate	Careful not to inconvenience or harm others. <i>Be considerate over your handwriting.</i>
docile	Willing to be taught or led or supervised or directed. <i>She s a black Labrador gentle and docile.</i>
genial	(especially of air or climate) pleasantly mild and warm. <i>Our genial host.</i>
gentle	Make or become gentle. <i>A gentle voice.</i>
gently	In a gentle manner. <i>He talked gently to the injured animal.</i>
humane	(of a branch of learning) intended to have a civilizing effect on people. <i>Humane methods of killing.</i>
humble	Of low birth or station (‘base’ is archaic in this sense). <i>Of humble or lowly birth.</i>
lenient	Tolerant or lenient. <i>In the view of the Court the sentence was too lenient.</i>
lightly	Indulging with temperance. <i>It was snowing lightly.</i>

mediterranean	Of or relating to or characteristic of or located near the Mediterranean Sea.
<u>meek</u>	Very docile. <i>She brought her meek little husband along.</i>
merciful	Gracious (used conventionally of royalty and high nobility). <i>William did not believe in being merciful to those who fought against him.</i>
<u>mildly</u>	In a gentle manner. <i>He had suffered mildly from the illness since he was 23.</i>
moderate	A person who holds moderate views especially in politics. <i>A moderate fine.</i>
<u>mosaic</u>	A pattern resembling a mosaic. <i>The bird's plumage was a mosaic of slate grey blue and brown.</i>
mottle	A spot or patch forming part of a mottled arrangement. <i>The ship was not dull grey as distance had suggested but a mottle of khaki and black and olive green.</i>
restrained	Under restraint. <i>His restrained gentlemanly voice.</i>
sedation	A state of reduced excitement or anxiety that is induced by the administration of a sedative agent. <i>He was distraught with grief and under sedation.</i>
sedative	Promoting calm or inducing sleep. <i>Took a hot drink with sedative properties before going to bed.</i>
soft	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music soft in a quiet subdued tone. <i>Soft hands.</i>
<u>softly</u>	Used as a direction in music to be played relatively softly. <i>She softly brushed the tears away.</i>
subtropical	Of or relating to or characteristic of conditions in the subtropics. <i>North Island enjoys a subtropical climate.</i>
tapping	The action of striking against something with a quick light blow or blows, or a sound made in this way. <i>Crews heard tapping from deep underground.</i>
temperate	Free from extremes; mild; or characteristic of such weather or climate. <i>A temperate response to an insult.</i>
tranquilizer	A drug used to reduce stress or tension without reducing mental clarity.

Not pretentious or arrogant; modest.
