<a href="#">amiable</a>	Diffusing warmth and friendliness. <i>The <b>amiable</b> young man greeted me enthusiastically.</i>
<b>balmy</b>	Mild and pleasant. <i>The <b>balmy</b> days of late summer.</i>
<b>clement</b>	Inclined to show mercy. <i>A more <b>clement</b> judge reduced the sentence.</i>
<b>condescendingly</b>	With condescension; in a patronizing manner. <i>He treats his secretary <b>condescendingly</b>.</i>
<a href="#">considerate</a>	Careful not to inconvenience or harm others. <i>Be <b>considerate</b> over your handwriting.</i>
<a href="#">docile</a>	Willing to be taught or led or supervised or directed. <i>She s a black Labrador gentle and <b>docile</b>.</i>
<a href="#">genial</a>	(especially of air or climate) pleasantly mild and warm. <i>Our <b>genial</b> host.</i>
<a href="#">gentle</a>	Make or become gentle. <i>A <b>gentle</b> voice.</i>
<b>gently</b>	In a gentle manner. <i>He talked <b>gently</b> to the injured animal.</i>
<a href="#">humane</a>	(of a branch of learning) intended to have a civilizing effect on people. <i><b>Humane</b> methods of killing.</i>
<b>humble</b>	Of low birth or station (‘base’ is archaic in this sense). <i>Of <b>humble</b> or lowly birth.</i>
<a href="#">lenient</a>	Tolerant or lenient. <i>In the view of the Court the sentence was too <b>lenient</b>.</i>
<a href="#">lightly</a>	Indulging with temperance. <i>It was snowing <b>lightly</b>.</i>

<b>mediterranean</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of or located near the Mediterranean Sea.
<b><u>meek</u></b>	Very docile. <i>She brought her <b>meek</b> little husband along.</i>
<b>merciful</b>	Gracious (used conventionally of royalty and high nobility). <i>William did not believe in being <b>merciful</b> to those who fought against him.</i>
<b><u>mildly</u></b>	In a gentle manner. <i>He had suffered <b>mildly</b> from the illness since he was 23.</i>
<b>moderate</b>	A person who holds moderate views especially in politics. <i>A <b>moderate</b> fine.</i>
<b><u>mosaic</u></b>	A pattern resembling a mosaic. <i>The bird's plumage was a <b>mosaic</b> of slate grey blue and brown.</i>
<b>mottle</b>	A spot or patch forming part of a mottled arrangement. <i>The ship was not dull grey as distance had suggested but a <b>mottle</b> of khaki and black and olive green.</i>
<b>restrained</b>	Under restraint. <i>His <b>restrained</b> gentlemanly voice.</i>
<b>sedation</b>	A state of reduced excitement or anxiety that is induced by the administration of a sedative agent. <i>He was distraught with grief and under <b>sedation</b>.</i>
<b>sedative</b>	Promoting calm or inducing sleep. <i>Took a hot drink with <b>sedative</b> properties before going to bed.</i>
<b>soft</b>	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music soft in a quiet subdued tone. <i><b>Soft</b> hands.</i>
<b><u>softly</u></b>	Used as a direction in music to be played relatively softly. <i>She <b>softly</b> brushed the tears away.</i>
<b>subtropical</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of conditions in the subtropics. <i>North Island enjoys a <b>subtropical</b> climate.</i>
<b>tapping</b>	The action of striking against something with a quick light blow or blows, or a sound made in this way. <i>Crews heard <b>tapping</b> from deep underground.</i>
<b>temperate</b>	Free from extremes; mild; or characteristic of such weather or climate. <i>A <b>temperate</b> response to an insult.</i>
<b>tranquilizer</b>	A drug used to reduce stress or tension without reducing mental clarity.
