## Mildly as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Mildly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “mildly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In a mild or gentle manner.*
- *Not seriously.*
- *To a moderate degree.*
- *To a slight extent.*
- *In a gentle manner.*

### Synonyms of "Mildly" as an adverb (3 Words)

- easily** With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily.  
*Was **easily** confused.*
- gently** With only gradual inclines.  
*She **gently** broke the news to her mum.*
- leniently** In a permissively lenient manner.  
*He felt incensed that Tarrant should have been treated so **leniently** given his crime.*

## Usage Examples of "Mildly" as an adverb

- *He had suffered mildly from the illness since he was 23.*
- *'Don't be childish,' he reproved mildly.*
- *He kept his voice mildly curious.*

## Associations of "Mildly" (30 Words)

<b><u>buzz</u></b>	Make a buzzing sound. <i>This amp is loud enough to make my ears <b>buzz</b> for a couple of hours on full blast.</i>
<b>calmly</b>	With self-possession (especially in times of stress). <i>He spoke slowly and <b>calmly</b>.</i>
<b>concealment</b>	The action of hiding something or preventing it from being known. <i>The simplest <b>concealment</b> is to match perfectly the color of the background.</i>
<b>croon</b>	Sing softly. <i>The female vocalist <b>crooned</b> smoky blues into the microphone.</i>
<b>gently</b>	With a mild, kind, or tender manner. <i><b>Gently</b> pat your skin dry.</i>
<b><u>giggle</u></b>	Continuous uncontrollable giggling. <i>It should be a right <b>giggle</b>.</i>
<b>gracefully</b>	In a respectful and dignified way. <i>I will <b>gracefully</b> bow out of the discussion.</i>
<b>graciously</b>	In a gracious or graceful manner. <i>Helen <b>graciously</b> accepted the award.</i>
<b><u>growl</u></b>	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>The <b>growl</b> of diesel engines.</i>
<b>hiss</b>	Express or utter with a hiss. <i>He was <b>hissed</b> off the stage.</i>
<b><u>hug</u></b>	Hold (someone) tightly in your arms, usually with fondness. <i>She <b>hugged</b> herself with secret joy.</i>
<b><u>hum</u></b>	Sound with a monotonous hum. <i>There is a constant <b>hum</b> of military preparation.</i>
<b>inactive</b>	Not engaging in or involving any or much physical activity. <i>The <b>inactive</b> X chromosome.</i>

<b>infiltration</b>	A process in which individuals (or small groups) penetrate an area (especially the military penetration of enemy positions without detection). <i>Cross border <b>infiltrations</b>.</i>
<b>lightly</b>	Without severe punishment; leniently. <i>Apply paint <b>lightly</b>.</i>
<b>mild</b>	Mild and pleasant. <i><b>Mild</b> flulike symptoms.</i>
<b>murmur</b>	The quiet or subdued expression of a particular feeling by a group of people. <i>Now they do not simply <b>murmur</b> against him they quarrel noisily with him.</i>
<b>nibble</b>	A show of interest in a commercial opportunity. <i>He <b>nibbled</b> a biscuit.</i>
<b>peace</b>	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i>The roommates lived in <b>peace</b> together.</i>
<b>quiet</b>	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>All he wanted was a <b>quiet</b> drink.</i>
<b>quietly</b>	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>He worked <b>quietly</b> and diligently.</i>
<b>rustle</b>	Make a dry crackling sound. <i><b>Rustle</b> cattle.</i>
<b>sibilant</b>	A sibilant speech sound. <i>His <b>sibilant</b> whisper.</i>
<b>silent</b>	Not expressed aloud. <i>The wood was still and <b>silent</b>.</i>
<b>soft</b>	In a relaxed manner or without hardship soft is nonstandard. <i><b>Soft</b> music.</i>
<b>softly</b>	Used as a direction in music to be played relatively softly. <i>Her <b>softly</b> rounded belly.</i>
<b>stealth</b>	Cautious and surreptitious action or movement. <i>A <b>stealth</b> bomber.</i>
<b>tapping</b>	The action of striking against something with a quick light blow or blows, or a sound made in this way. <i>He heard the <b>tapping</b> of the man's cane.</i>
<b>wail</b>	Utter a wail. <i>Christopher let out a <b>wail</b>.</i>

**whisper**
