Definitions of "Mildly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “mildly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In a mild or gentle manner.*
- *Not seriously.*
- *To a moderate degree.*
- *To a slight extent.*
- *In a gentle manner.*

Synonyms of "Mildly" as an adverb (3 Words)

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| easily | With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>Was easily confused.</i> |
| gently | With only gradual inclines. <i>She gently broke the news to her mum.</i> |
| leniently | In a permissively lenient manner. <i>He felt incensed that Tarrant should have been treated so leniently given his crime.</i> |

Usage Examples of "Mildly" as an adverb

- *He had suffered mildly from the illness since he was 23.*
- *'Don't be childish,' he reproved mildly.*
- *He kept his voice mildly curious.*

Associations of "Mildly" (30 Words)

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| <u>buzz</u> | Make a buzzing sound. <i>This amp is loud enough to make my ears buzz for a couple of hours on full blast.</i> |
| calmly | With self-possession (especially in times of stress). <i>He spoke slowly and calmly.</i> |
| concealment | The action of hiding something or preventing it from being known. <i>The simplest concealment is to match perfectly the color of the background.</i> |
| croon | Sing softly. <i>The female vocalist crooned smoky blues into the microphone.</i> |
| gently | With a mild, kind, or tender manner. <i>Gently pat your skin dry.</i> |
| <u>giggle</u> | Continuous uncontrollable giggling. <i>It should be a right giggle.</i> |
| gracefully | In a respectful and dignified way. <i>I will gracefully bow out of the discussion.</i> |
| graciously | In a gracious or graceful manner. <i>Helen graciously accepted the award.</i> |
| <u>growl</u> | The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>The growl of diesel engines.</i> |
| hiss | Express or utter with a hiss. <i>He was hissed off the stage.</i> |
| <u>hug</u> | Hold (someone) tightly in your arms, usually with fondness. <i>She hugged herself with secret joy.</i> |
| <u>hum</u> | Sound with a monotonous hum. <i>There is a constant hum of military preparation.</i> |
| inactive | Not engaging in or involving any or much physical activity. <i>The inactive X chromosome.</i> |

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| infiltration | A process in which individuals (or small groups) penetrate an area (especially the military penetration of enemy positions without detection). <i>Cross border infiltrations.</i> |
| lightly | Without severe punishment; leniently. <i>Apply paint lightly.</i> |
| mild | Mild and pleasant. <i>Mild flulike symptoms.</i> |
| murmur | The quiet or subdued expression of a particular feeling by a group of people. <i>Now they do not simply murmur against him they quarrel noisily with him.</i> |
| nibble | A show of interest in a commercial opportunity. <i>He nibbled a biscuit.</i> |
| peace | A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i>The roommates lived in peace together.</i> |
| quiet | With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>All he wanted was a quiet drink.</i> |
| quietly | With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>He worked quietly and diligently.</i> |
| rustle | Make a dry crackling sound. <i>Rustle cattle.</i> |
| sibilant | A sibilant speech sound. <i>His sibilant whisper.</i> |
| silent | Not expressed aloud. <i>The wood was still and silent.</i> |
| soft | In a relaxed manner or without hardship soft is nonstandard. <i>Soft music.</i> |
| softly | Used as a direction in music to be played relatively softly. <i>Her softly rounded belly.</i> |
| stealth | Cautious and surreptitious action or movement. <i>A stealth bomber.</i> |
| tapping | The action of striking against something with a quick light blow or blows, or a sound made in this way. <i>He heard the tapping of the man's cane.</i> |
| wail | Utter a wail. <i>Christopher let out a wail.</i> |

A soft or confidential tone of voice a whispered word or phrase.
*He managed to **whisper** a faint goodbye.*
