- *Lacking the thinking capacity characteristic of a conscious being.*
- *Devoid of intelligence.*
- *Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw.*
- *Requiring little mental effort.*
- *Acting or done without justification and with no concern for the consequences.*
- *Not mindful or attentive.*
- *(of an activity) so simple or repetitive as to be performed automatically.*

| blockish | Big, bulky, or crude in form or appearance. <i>His blockish architecture is ugly if functional.</i> |
| brainless | Not using intelligence. <i>A brainless bimbo.</i> |
| brutish | Resembling a beast; showing lack of human sensibility. <i>A dull and brutish man.</i> |
| <u>careless</u> | (usually followed by `of') without due thought or consideration. <i>He admitted careless driving.</i> |
| careless of | Effortless and unstudied. |
| doltish | Heavy and dull and stupid. <i>A doltish character.</i> |
| dull | (of business) not active or brisk. <i>Dull greens and blues.</i> |
| empty-headed | Lacking seriousness; given to frivolity. |
| foolish | Lacking good sense or judgement; unwise. <i>Foolish remarks.</i> |
| forgetful | Not mindful or attentive. <i>She was soon forgetful of the time.</i> |
| gratuitous | Done without good reason; uncalled for. <i>Gratuitous violence.</i> |
| half-witted | Retarded in intellectual development. |
| heedless of | Marked by or paying little heed or attention-Franklin D. Roosevelt. |
| <u>idiotic</u> | Very stupid. <i>I was able to hum its idiotic theme tune.</i> |

| indifferent to | Having only a limited ability to react chemically; chemically inactive. |

| insensible to | Unresponsive to stimulation. |
| <u>mechanical</u> | (of an action) done without thought or spontaneity; automatic. <i>A mechanical device.</i> |
| obtuse | Lacking in insight or discernment- Jasper Griffin. <i>It had strange obtuse teeth.</i> |
| reasonless | Not endowed with the capacity to reason. <i>An apparently arbitrary and reasonless change.</i> |
| <u>robotic</u> | Resembling the unthinking functioning of a machine. <i>His robotic voice.</i> |
| routine | Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>The Ministry insisted that this was just a routine annual drill.</i> |
| senseless | Lacking sense or understanding or judgment. <i>The attack left a policeman beaten senseless.</i> |
| slow-witted | Retarded in intellectual development. |
| <u>thoughtless</u> | Showing lack of careful thought. <i>The thoughtless saying of a great princess on being informed that the people had no bread Let them eat cake.</i> |
| unaware of | Not aware. |
| <u>unintelligent</u> | Having or showing a low level of intelligence. <i>A dull job with lazy and unintelligent co workers.</i> |
| unmindful | Not conscious or aware. <i>While thus unmindful of his steps he stumbled.</i> |
| unmindful of | Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw. |
| unreasoning | Not based on reason or evidence. <i>Unreasoning panic.</i> |
| unthinking | Expressed, done, or acting without proper consideration of the consequences. <i>She was at pains to correct unthinking prejudices.</i> |
| vacuous | Devoid of significance or point. <i>A vacuous mind.</i> |

wanton Lively; playful.
Wanton behavior.

witless Foolish; stupid.
He was scared **witless**.
