- *Not marked by the use of reason.*
- *Not thinking of or concerned about.*
- *Lacking the thinking capacity characteristic of a conscious being.*
- *Devoid of intelligence.*
- *Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw.*
- *Requiring little mental effort.*
- *Acting or done without justification and with no concern for the consequences.*
- *Not mindful or attentive.*
- *(of an activity) so simple or repetitive as to be performed automatically.*

<a href="#"><u>automatic</u></a>	(of a firearm) self-loading and able to fire continuously until the ammunition is exhausted or the pressure on the trigger is released. <i><b>Automatic</b> weapons.</i>
<b>barbaric</b>	Without civilizing influences-Margaret Meade. <i><b>Barbaric</b> use of color or ornament.</i>
<b>barbarous</b>	Primitive and uncivilized. <i>Avoiding <b>barbarous</b> sentences or ambiguities.</i>
<b>blind to</b>	Unable or unwilling to perceive or understand.
<b>blockish</b>	Big, bulky, or crude in form or appearance. <i>His <b>blockish</b> architecture is ugly if functional.</i>
<b>brainless</b>	Not using intelligence. <i>A <b>brainless</b> bimbo.</i>
<b>brutish</b>	Resembling a beast; showing lack of human sensibility. <i>A dull and <b>brutish</b> man.</i>
<a href="#"><u>careless</u></a>	(usually followed by `of') without due thought or consideration. <i>He admitted <b>careless</b> driving.</i>
<b>careless of</b>	Effortless and unstudied.
<b>doltish</b>	Heavy and dull and stupid. <i>A <b>doltish</b> character.</i>
<b>dull</b>	(of business) not active or brisk. <i><b>Dull</b> greens and blues.</i>
<b>empty-headed</b>	Lacking seriousness; given to frivolity.
<b>foolish</b>	Lacking good sense or judgement; unwise. <i><b>Foolish</b> remarks.</i>
<b>forgetful</b>	Not mindful or attentive. <i>She was soon <b>forgetful</b> of the time.</i>
<b>gratuitous</b>	Done without good reason; uncalled for. <i><b>Gratuitous</b> violence.</i>
<b>half-witted</b>	Retarded in intellectual development.
<b>heedless of</b>	Marked by or paying little heed or attention-Franklin D. Roosevelt.
<a href="#"><u>idiotic</u></a>	Very stupid. <i>I was able to hum its <b>idiotic</b> theme tune.</i>

<b>imbecile</b>	Stupid; idiotic. <i>Try not to make <b>imbecile</b> remarks.</i>
<b>imbecilic</b>	Having a mental age of three to seven years.
<b>indifferent to</b>	Having only a limited ability to react chemically; chemically inactive.
<b>indiscriminate</b>	Failing to make or recognize distinctions. <i>The <b>indiscriminate</b> use of antibiotics can cause problems.</i>
<b>insensible to</b>	Unresponsive to stimulation.
<b><u>mechanical</u></b>	(of an action) done without thought or spontaneity; automatic. <i>A <b>mechanical</b> device.</i>
<b>obtuse</b>	Lacking in insight or discernment- Jasper Griffin. <i>It had strange <b>obtuse</b> teeth.</i>
<b>reasonless</b>	Not endowed with the capacity to reason. <i>An apparently arbitrary and <b>reasonless</b> change.</i>
<b><u>robotic</u></b>	Resembling the unthinking functioning of a machine. <i>His <b>robotic</b> voice.</i>
<b>routine</b>	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>The Ministry insisted that this was just a <b>routine</b> annual drill.</i>
<b>senseless</b>	Lacking sense or understanding or judgment. <i>The attack left a policeman beaten <b>senseless</b>.</i>
<b>slow-witted</b>	Retarded in intellectual development.
<b><u>thoughtless</u></b>	Showing lack of careful thought. <i>The <b>thoughtless</b> saying of a great princess on being informed that the people had no bread Let them eat cake.</i>
<b>unaware of</b>	Not aware.
<b><u>unintelligent</u></b>	Having or showing a low level of intelligence. <i>A dull job with lazy and <b>unintelligent</b> co workers.</i>
<b>unmindful</b>	Not conscious or aware. <i>While thus <b>unmindful</b> of his steps he stumbled.</i>
<b>unmindful of</b>	Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw.
<b>unreasoning</b>	Not based on reason or evidence. <i><b>Unreasoning</b> panic.</i>
<b>unthinking</b>	Expressed, done, or acting without proper consideration of the consequences. <i>She was at pains to correct <b>unthinking</b> prejudices.</i>
<b>vacuous</b>	Devoid of significance or point. <i>A <b>vacuous</b> mind.</i>

**wanton** Lively; playful.  
**Wanton** behavior.

**witless** Foolish; stupid.  
He was scared **witless**.
