### Definitions of "Mingle" as a verb

- *Get involved or mixed-up with.*
- *Move among and engage with others at a social function.*
- *Be all mixed up or jumbled together.*
- *Mix or cause to mix together.*
- *To bring or combine together or with something else.*

### Synonyms of "Mingle" as a verb (28 Words)

<b>amalgamate</b>	Combine or unite to form one organization or structure. <b><i>Amalgamated</i></b> zinc.
<b>associate with others</b>	Keep company with; hang out with.
<b>blend</b>	Blend or harmonize. <b><i>Blend</i></b> the cornflour with a tablespoon of water.

circulate

Send copies of a letter or leaflet to (a group of people).  
*Rumours of his arrest **circulated**.*

coalesce

Fuse or cause to grow together.  
*The puddles had **coalesced** into shallow streams.*

**combine**

Combine so as to form a whole mix.  
*An ideal place to **combine** shopping and sightseeing.*

**commingle**

Mix or blend.  
*The part of the brain where the senses **commingle**.*

**commix**

Mix; mingle.  
*Beat them till they be thoroughly **commixed**.*

compound

Reckon (interest) on previously accumulated interest.  
*A dialect **compounded** of Spanish and Dutch.*

**consort with others**

Keep company with; hang out with.

**fraternize**

Associate or form a friendship with someone, especially when one is not supposed to.  
*She ignored Elisabeth's warning glare against fraternizing with the enemy.*

fuse

Provide a circuit or electrical appliance with a fuse.  
*Powdered glass was **fused** to a metal base.*

**get together**

Undergo (as of injuries and illnesses).

**interlace**

Cross or be crossed intricately together; interweave.  
*Jane **interlaced** her fingers to form a cup.*

**intermingle**

Mix or mingle together.  
*We don't **intermingle** much.*

**intermix**

Combine into one.  
*The ore had to be handled so that it was not inadvertently **intermixed** with other material.*

**interweave**

Weave or become woven together.  
*The rugs are made by tightly interweaving the strands.*

**join**

Be or become joined or united or linked.  
*She **joined** the department last year.*

**jumble**

Be all mixed up or jumbled together.  
*His words **jumbled**.*

**marry**

Splice (rope ends) together without increasing their girth.  
*Eric asked me to **marry** him.*

meld

Lose its distinct outline or shape; blend gradually.  
*The nylon bristles shrivel and **meld** together.*

<u>merge</u>	Combine or cause to combine to form a single entity. <i>The cells <b>merge</b>.</i>
<u>mesh</u>	Entangle or catch in or as if in a mesh. <i>One gear <b>meshes</b> with the input gear.</i>
<b>mix</b>	Mix together different elements. <i>Peppercorns are sometimes <b>mixed</b> with other spices.</i>
<b>rub shoulders</b>	Move over something with pressure.
<b>socialize</b>	Participate in social activities; mix socially with others. <i>Health care should be <b>socialized</b>.</i>
<u>unify</u>	To bring or combine together or with something else. <i>Opposition groups struggling to <b>unify</b> around the goal of replacing the regime.</i>
<b>unite</b>	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>The two Germanys officially <b>united</b>.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Mingle" as a verb

- *A chance to mingle with celebs.*
- *The sound of voices mingled with a scraping of chairs.*
- *A smell which mingled disinfectant and soap.*
- *Resourcefully he mingled music and dance.*

## Associations of "Mingle" (30 Words)

<b>amalgam</b>	An alloy of mercury with another metal usually silver used by dentists to fill cavities in teeth except for iron and platinum all metals dissolve in mercury and chemists refer to the resulting mercury mixtures as amalgams. <i><b>Amalgam</b> fillings.</i>
<b>amalgamate</b>	Combine or unite to form one organization or structure. <i>Numerous small British railway companies <b>amalgamated</b>.</i>
<b>blend</b>	Blend or harmonize. <i>The tea is <b>blended</b> using leaves from estates in Sri Lanka Kenya India and Indonesia.</i>
<b>blending</b>	The act of blending components together thoroughly. <i>Clever cultural <b>blendings</b>.</i>
<u>coalesce</u>	Come together to form one mass or whole. <i>His idea served to <b>coalesce</b> all that happened into one connected whole.</i>

<b>combination</b>	A sequence of numbers or letters that opens a combination lock. <i>A good uppercut hook <b>combination</b>.</i>
<b>combine</b>	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>Oxygen and hydrogen do not <b>combine</b> at room temperatures.</i>
<b>commingle</b>	Mix together different elements. <i>The part of the brain where the senses <b>commingle</b>.</i>
<b>compound</b>	Composed of more than one part compound flower heads. <i><b>Compound</b> flower heads.</i>
<b>conflate</b>	Mix together different elements. <i>The urban crisis <b>conflates</b> a number of different economic political and social issues.</i>
<b>conjugate</b>	A mixture of two partially miscible liquids A and B produces two conjugate solutions one of A in B and another of B in A. <i>E coli only <b>conjugate</b> when one of the cells possesses fertility genes.</i>
<b>hodgepodge</b>	A confused mixture; a hotchpotch. <i>Rob s living room was a <b>hodgepodge</b> of modern furniture and antiques.</i>
<b>integrate</b>	Become one become integrated. <i>Transport planning should be <b>integrated</b> with energy policy.</i>
<b>intermingle</b>	Mix or mingle together. <i>Riesling grapes were always <b>intermingled</b> with other varieties.</i>
<b>intermix</b>	Mix together. <i>Along its southern edge low trees <b>intermix</b> with the shrubs.</i>
<b>join</b>	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>Our paths <b>joined</b>.</i>
<b>jumble</b>	Articles collected for a jumble sale. <i>We are collecting <b>jumble</b> for charity.</i>
<b>melange</b>	A varied mixture. <i>A <b>melange</b> of tender vegetables and herbs.</i>
<b>meld</b>	A thing formed by melding a combination. <i>The nylon bristles shrivel and <b>meld</b> together.</i>
<b>merge</b>	Absorb (a title or estate) in another. <i>He agreed to <b>merge</b> his broadcasting company with a multinational concern.</i>
<b>mess</b>	Have one s meals with a particular person especially as a member of an armed forces mess. <i>They had some problems with dogs <b>messing</b> in the store.</i>

<b>mix</b>	<p>A version of a recording in which the component tracks are mixed in a different way from the original. <i>He continues to <b>mix</b> an off hand sense of humour with a sharp insight.</i></p>
<b><u>mixture</u></b>	<p>An event that combines things in a mixture. <i>The old town is a <b>mixture</b> of narrow medieval streets and 18th century architecture.</i></p>
<b>muddle</b>	<p>Informal terms for a difficult situation. <i>The finances were in a <b>muddle</b>.</i></p>
<b>patchwork</b>	<p>Sewing consisting of pieces of different materials sewn together in a pattern. <i>A <b>patchwork</b> bedspread.</i></p>
<b>synthesis</b>	<p>The combination of components or elements to form a connected whole. <i>The <b>synthesis</b> of intellect and emotion in his work.</i></p>
<b><u>unify</u></b>	<p>Become one. <i>Opposition groups struggling to <b>unify</b> around the goal of replacing the regime.</i></p>
<b>unite</b>	<p>Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>The two Germanys officially <b>united</b>.</i></p>
<b><u>united</u></b>	<p>Joined together politically, for a common purpose, or by common feelings. <i>Presented a <b>united</b> front.</i></p>
<b>weld</b>	<p>Forge an article by welding. <i>Her gratitude <b>welded</b> her to him.</i></p>
