Definitions of "Minion" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “minion” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A servile or fawning dependant.*
- *A follower or underling of a powerful person, especially a servile or unimportant one.*



Synonyms of "Minion" as a noun (18 Words)

- camp follower** Something that is considered amusing not because of its originality but because of its unoriginality.
- [creature](#)** A person who is controlled by others and is used to perform unpleasant or dishonest tasks for someone else.
*As fellow **creatures** on this planet animals deserve respect.*
- fawner** A person who gives a servile display of exaggerated flattery or affection.
*The consummate **fawner** was able to sway a president with false deference.*
- flatterer** A person who lavishes praise, often insincerely; a sycophant.
*He is not allowing **flatterers** to deceive him.*
- flunkey** A person of unquestioning obedience.
- follower** Someone who travels behind or pursues another.
***Followers** of Nietzsche.*
- hanger-on** Someone who persistently (and annoyingly) follows along.

henchman	(in Scotland) the principal attendant of a Highland chief. <i>The dictator s henchman.</i>
hireling	A person who works only for money. <i>The government s paid hirelings assure us that we re on our way out of recession.</i>
lackey	A servant, especially a liveried footman or manservant. <i>Lackeys were waiting to help them from the carriage.</i>
lickspittle	A person who behaves obsequiously to those in power. <i>He is a lickspittle for the Establishment.</i>
myrmidon	A follower who carries out orders without question. <i>One of Hitler s myrmidons.</i>
<u>servant</u>	A person working in the service of another (especially in the household). <i>He was a great servant of the Labour Party.</i>
stooge	A subordinate used by another to do unpleasant routine work. <i>Party stooges put there to do a job on behalf of central office.</i>
sycophant	A person who tries to please someone in order to gain a personal advantage.
toady	A person who tries to please someone in order to gain a personal advantage.
underling	A person lower in status or rank. <i>She was shouting orders at underlings between gulps of coffee.</i>
vassal	A person or country in a subordinate position to another. <i>A vassal state of the Ottoman Empire.</i>



Usage Examples of "Minion" as a noun

- *He gets oppressed minions like me to fob them off.*



Associations of "Minion" (30 Words)

acolyte	A person assisting a priest in a religious service or procession. <i>She runs the department through a small group of acolytes.</i>
allegiant	That owes or gives allegiance (to someone or something); loyal, faithful. <i>It is impossible to be allegiant to two opposing forces.</i>
butler	A manservant (usually the head servant of a household) who has charge of wines and the table.
<u>cleaner</u>	A device for cleaning such as a vacuum cleaner. <i>My suit s at the cleaners.</i>
dutiful	Motivated by duty rather than desire or enthusiasm. <i>A dutiful visit.</i>
enslave	Make a slave of; bring into servitude. <i>They were enslaved by their need to take drugs.</i>
epigone	An inferior imitator of some distinguished writer or artist of musician. <i>The humdrum compositions of some of Beethoven s epigones.</i>

factotum	A servant employed to do a variety of jobs. <i>He was employed as the general factotum.</i>
<u>faithful</u>	Those who are faithful to a particular religion or political party. <i>The film was faithful to the book.</i>
fawning	Attempting to win favor by flattery. <i>Fawning interviews with Hollywood celebs.</i>
<u>flatter</u>	Cause (someone) to feel honoured and pleased. <i>She was flattering him in order to avoid doing what he wanted.</i>
follower	Someone who travels behind or pursues another. <i>She remains an immensely divisive figure but she has a million followers on Facebook.</i>
footman	A soldier in the infantry.
henchman	A squire or page of honour to a person of rank. <i>The dictator s henchman.</i>
hireling	A person employed to do menial work. <i>The poorly paid hirelings in their shabby clothes.</i>
<u>housekeeper</u>	A person employed to perform cleaning and other domestic tasks in a hotel or institution.
lackey	Behave in a servile way towards (someone). <i>Lackeys were waiting to help them from the carriage.</i>
<u>loyal</u>	Unwavering in devotion to friend or vow or cause. <i>Loyal subjects.</i>
<u>maid</u>	An unmarried girl (especially a virgin). <i>Mary eventually managed to find a job as a maid.</i>
<u>mercenary</u>	Primarily concerned with making money at the expense of ethics. <i>She s nothing but a mercenary little gold digger.</i>
<u>obedient</u>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>An obedient soldier.</i>
<u>parasite</u>	An animal or plant that lives in or on a host (another animal or plant); it obtains nourishment from the host without benefiting or killing the host. <i>The parasite attaches itself to the mouths of fishes.</i>
retainer	A reduced rent paid to retain accommodation during a period of non-occupancy. <i>A guitar string retainer.</i>

- servant** A person who performs duties for others, especially a person employed in a house on domestic duties or as a personal attendant.
*He was a great **servant** of the Labour Party.*
- servile** Having or showing an excessive willingness to serve or please others.
*The **servile** condition of the peasants.*
- slimy** Covered with or resembling slime.
*A **slimy** cigar puffing political fixer.*
- submissive** Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant S H Adams.
*Replacing troublemakers with more **submissive** people.*
- sycophant** A person who acts obsequiously towards someone important in order to gain advantage.
- sycophantic** Behaving or done in an obsequious way in order to gain advantage.
*A **sycophantic** interview.*
- toady** A person who behaves obsequiously to someone important.
*She imagined him **toadying** to his rich clients.*
